A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JULIE

I've always been struck by the statement "practicing medicine." It could be any profession or skill, but when I look for a doctor, I'm not looking for one who is still practicing. But then I think, should I be?



Recently, one of the youth at a retreat asked me about how one might continue to grow in faith,

making faith and God more a priority in their life. Maybe that is a question we all have had, or should have had. Maybe we all need to be practicing discipleship—that is how we come to know and trust God as the priority in our life that God commands.

Practicing discipleship involves intentionally paying attention to all aspects of our life and faith. It isn't just a Sunday or Wednesday night thing. It isn't just when convenient. Practicing discipleship pulls us out of our comfort zones until it becomes routine. It is learning new things—like someone who practices medicine. It makes us better at the skill, no matter how good we are when we begin.



Choose one you really need to focus on and push yourself. Get up earlier; come to worship, open your Bible, pray. Stretch your giving a bit, go serve in a place you are interested in, encourage the community of faith and invite others to join us.

So begin today, and practice discipleship!

CAREGIVING

In October I attended a three-hour session in Frankenmuth that focused on how caregivers can make the best, or at least better, of a situation in which they and their care receivers are in. If you are currently a caregiver, thinking you are nearing the time when you will become a caregiver, or know of someone in either of these situations, consider checking out *The Caregiving Years* by Denise M. Brown from our Library. This book gives solid and practical guidance in each of the six caregiving periods:



- 1. The Expectant Caregiver
- 2. The Freshman Caregiver
- 3. The Entrenched Caregiver
- 4. The Pragmatic Caregiver
- 5. The Transitioning Caregiver
- 6. The Godspeed Caregiver

With respect to the first section, The Expectant Caregiver, this is applicable really to every adult. Consider the two introductory questions: Who might need your care in the future, and what questions can you ask now? Who might provide care for you in the future, and what information can you share now? Don't worry about the future, but do plan and prepare for it.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Members in Christ,

The Council and Ascension Ministries have accomplished plenty this year and I am proud to share a few of them with all of you. I am sure I missed a few of your favorites; these are just a few that percolate to my frontal lobe.



- We have doubled our mission support since this time last year. We are currently giving 4% of our weekly offering.
- Thanks to the Trustees, we have saved \$2,823.54 over the last 16 months, thanks to their LED lighting initiative.
- We hosted for the first time, Financial Peace University. We are planning on continuing this program, as it was well received by all who attended.
- We hosted an informative safety event in January, inviting several area churches, with over 100 in attendance.
- We tackled an issue that hasn't been done in at least 20 years. We sent letters to our inactive members asking them to respond as to whether or not they wanted to keep their membership. This went well. We cleaned up our membership and inspired a few to return to the pews.
- We continue to make a positive impact on the community by sharing the kingdom of God (one of our "initiatives"). We did this several ways:
 - We hosted yet another successful soccer camp.
 - We gave away over 250 backpacks, socks/undies, and clothing at our Back to School Fair. Although not the most successful in numbers, it was appreciated by those who received.
 - We support 53 students from the Swan Valley, Hemlock, and St. Charles school districts with weekend backpacks for elementary students who receive free breakfast and lunches. These backpacks provide meals they may otherwise go without over the weekend. Did I mention we do this WEEKLY?
- We have worked within the 2018 budget, made payroll, and paid our bills. We ran a stewardship campaign. We are paying more on our mortgage principle than interest.
- We have put together a realistic 2019 budget, although it is a deficit budget. We have wants and needs, just like every household. We pared the budget down to our needs, and set our wants aside.



HELPING THE ELDERLY DURING THE WINTER MONTHS

Here are some tips to help the elderly:

Stock emergency resources in their homes:

- Have emergency kits in an easily accessible place.
- Have at least a seven-day supply of water and prescription medications.
- Have non-perishable food on hand.

Eliminate fall risks:

- Create slip proof paths and make sure they wear shoes or slippers that grip.
- Keep driveways clear of snow.

Practice safety precautions in their car:

- Make sure they have emergency snow supplies in their car, including heating packs, blankets, and water, as well as a car phone and charger.
- Keep the gas tank full.

Keep an eye on their nutrition:

• Be sure your loved ones are getting meals. Keep extra food on hand in the freezer, as well as bottled and canned fruit juices.

Eliminate potential fire risks:

- Candles are always a risk; keep Christmas trees watered.
- Ensure smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms have fresh batteries and are placed appropriately throughout the house.

Provide your loved one with a cell phone:

- Be sure to show them how to charge it and use it.
- Be sure to provide them with emergency numbers pre-programmed in their phone.
- Additionally, provide a list of phone numbers that you can leave on the refrigerator and/or another easily accessible place in the home.




