

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JULIE

I decided to reprint a sermon I preached in 2016 at our joint Saginaw Thanksgiving service. I think it still applies.

Saying please and thank you were things I was taught early on, so much so that sometimes I find myself saying thank you when maybe it isn't exactly what I want or should say. I try to send thank you notes, let people know I appreciate them. Sometimes it is good to be



able to write a note to someone you appreciate. I don't think we say thanks enough. We are really good at being critical; but when things are going well, don't we sort of take this time for granted? We know that if we go to a restaurant and have bad food or service, we are going to tell everyone and post it on Facebook or Twitter. But if things are good, it is just what is expected, so we often fail to share this news of thanksgiving.

I am guessing that many of us have traditions that we have for Thanksgiving. Some of us will sit around the table and each person will share something they are thankful for. If I were to ask you tonight, "What are you thankful for?", what would you say? I think it is important to share what you are thankful for, with God and with the people you are thanking. I want to challenge us this year that we need to be more aware of giving thanks; but even more so, I challenge you to live thanks.

Some say talk is cheap, or put your money where your mouth is. I'm not sure that I can say the same about giving thanks; this talk of thanks is important. And yet I believe scripture calls us to more—to live a life of thankfulness, to live thanks, thanks-living. Paul says rejoice in the Lord always, and again, I say rejoice. (Philippians 4:4) Our Lord is calling us to live a life of thanks-giving, to live a life in thankfulness to the abundance we have received from God.

Some of us might be asking ourselves, what abundance? I don't have a ton of money or a ton of time. Things aren't working out in my favor at all. This kind of thinking leads to a very sour way of living, very little giving, and dare I say, very little living. We rush from one thing to another, all the time complaining that we don't have time.

In Shakespeare's *King Lear* is this quote: "How sharper than a serpent's tooth it is to have a thankless child!" Parents, many of you know the pain of trying your best and then feeling that your children are ungrateful. If I'm honest, I know that I was not as thankful for my parents as I probably should have been. I hated the word "no", and yet in retrospect that "no" saved me a lot of trouble, something I am thankful for now. But it isn't just in parenting. How many times do we wonder if anyone is thankful for what we've done?

However, I want to flip that around. What if what we do is out of thankfulness and not to receive thanks? If how we serve is out of gratitude for what we have, for our opportunities, instead of a way to receive the accolades from others, to have everyone else tell us how wonderful we are—even if it is helpful and nice to get those accolades. What if we move from thanks giving to thanks living? I believe that when we rejoice always, when we realize that everything we need is provided by God, we will live a life of thanks. We find ways to give back, to pay it forward, to willingly share all that we have.

What ways are you living a life of thanks? Do you ever even think about it? Is there someone else in this room that you see living a life of thanks—someone in your family, or in your congregation?


One piece of advice I gleaned from a famous television interviewer who focuses on positive thinking, is that at the end of the day, find at least three things to be thankful for that day. We often focus on what we didn't get done each day—but it changes your direction in life when you focus on the thanks—especially when you are ready to sleep. Sleep thankfully, and it may make living thankfully come easier.

So I challenge you to a day, a year, a life of thanks living.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Members in Christ,

We have set the Annual Budget Meeting for Sunday, December 2nd and have been working on presenting as close to a zero-based budget as we can. Zero-based budgeting is a method of budgeting in which all expenses must be justified for each new period. The process of zero-based budgeting starts from a "zero base," and every function within the organization is analyzed for its needs and costs. Zero-based budgeting requires that the existence of a program be justified in each fiscal year, as opposed to simply basing budgeting decisions on a previous year's funding level. As with our own personal home budgets, we have wants and needs, and the Council's job is to flesh out the difference between the two and present a realistic budget that meets the needs of the congregation. We, of course, do this with a little faith that in the end God will provide.



On December 2nd, we will also present a slate to vote on for the following positions: Treasurer, Vice-President, Minister of Outreach, Minister of Congregational Care, and two Synod Delegates. These are all important roles within the church body here at Ascension, for various reasons. None of them are glamourous or seemingly exciting, but they are each important in carrying out the mission of Ascension Lutheran Church and God's work in and outside our walls.

Voting Members: Two at large members of the congregation who serve a one-year term. These individuals are selected by the congregation to attend the Synod Assembly and vote on a variety of things including anything from electing our Bishop to passing resolutions and bylaws. The next Synod Assembly will be held May 16th—May 18th in Mt. Pleasant.

The roles of the President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary and the Ministers of Congregational Care, Outreach, Finance & Resource Management, and Spiritual Health serve on the Congregational Council. Council meets on the third Tuesday of the month and is tasked with the following to name a few:

- -to set goals and priorities; to do long-range planning; and evaluate activities in light of the mission and goals -to promote a climate of peace and goodwill, and foster mutual understanding when differences/conflicts arise
- -to oversee the financial and property matters of this congregation
- -to see that the congregational constitution, by laws and continuing resolutions are carried out

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Financial Secretary not only serve on the Congregational Council, but are the officers of this congregation. They oversee the staff, both called, and non-called positions.

Everyone's definition of exciting is different. We were all gifted with specific God-given talents and equipped with unique skills. None of the positions are glamorous, but are necessary to the function of the church here at Ascension and abroad. SHUT-IN CHRISTMAS BASKETS





INFORMATION FOR OPIOID MISUSE

Opioids include prescription medications used to treat pain such as morphine, codeine, methadone, oxycodone, hydrocodone, fentanyl, hydromorphone and buprenorphine. The national opioid epidemic knows no age boundaries. Emergency room visits for suspected opioid overdoses for people aged 55 and over increased 32% in 2017, according to a report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. According to research by the Department of Health and Human Services, hospital stays related to opioid misuse among adults 65 to 84 more than quadrupled over a 20-year period ending in 2012.

Patients have the power—and the responsibility—to guard against opioid misuse. When visiting the doctor, you should:

-Share medical history openly, including any history of drug use or addiction.

-Update your medication list to help your doctor assess interactions between medicines.

-Take medications only as prescribed.

-Seek immediate help from your doctor if side effects or unexpected symptoms appear.

-Discuss alternative pain management strategies.

At home, you should:

-Keep all medication away from children.

-Never share medications with others.

-Never mix pain medications with alcohol or sleeping.

Most opioid abuse happens because someone other than the patient uses the drug, so proper disposal of medications is critical. Tips to remember when you have opioids or other prescriptions at home:

-Some medications come with disposal directions, including whether they can be flushed down a toilet or disposed of in household trash. If you have any questions, a pharmacist can explain how to safely dispose of medications.

-Many communities have prescription drop-off days at police stations or city halls. In addition, the Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration maintains a database of drop-off locations. Go to bit.ly/disposalsite to search by zip code or city.
