PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Members in Christ,

Here are some quick but important updates about the happenings here at Ascension.

Spiritual Health: Recently Pastor hosted a "table" represented by those groups of individuals that it takes to make worship happen. A table, meaning everyone is welcome and no seat at the table is more important than the other; if one person doesn't show up there is an "empty" seat. A couple months ago I asked and you



answered how many hours and people it took to put on a worship service. This month I am asking, "Do you know how far in advance planning begins?". The answer is more than three months, with several steps between selection of readings from the lectionary to actual day of service, with many cogs in the wheel. Just like the seats at the table, if one of those cogs is missing or not functioning properly, worship doesn't run smoothly. This group will be examining every "seat" at the table to make sure we can celebrate worship together with our best efforts.

Finance & Resource Management: Keep up the good work everyone! Our "Raise the Roof" campaign as of 07/22/19 has brought in \$10,458. We are contributing 5.5% to mission support as of 07/01/19.

Outreach: It takes about \$5.50 to feed a child for the weekend. Our outreach team, under the leadership of Kathy York, has continued to secure grant monies to support this ever-growing area of need. She has also made partnerships with others in the community who are helping support this ever-growing program. One such example is Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, who is collecting food for the weekend bags every Sunday in August and will help fill the bags in September. Back to School Fair is scheduled for Thursday, August 8th. If you don't have an assigned role, please contact the church and we will find a way for you to take part. This is our 6th year, but it continues to require all hands on deck.

Congregational Care: If you haven't done so already, please take the time to fill out a Time and Talent Sheet. Whether you do this electronically, or via paper and pencil, it is important to the mission of the church.

HEALTH HIGHLIGHTS

Health Highlights by Traci Collier

WATER SAFETY

Swimming is a great activity. Not only are there lots of physical benefits; it's also something the whole family can enjoy. But like a lot of things in life, it also comes with risk. Learning to be safe around water is imperative, and starting children younger is better.

•Enrolling children in swimming lessons at an early age can decrease the risk of drowning by as much as 88% when children aged 1-4 years take swimming lessons.



•Adults can also benefit from refresher courses. It is a good idea that every member of your family learns to swim so that they at least have water competency. This includes: being able to safely enter the water, get a breath, stay afloat, change positions in the water and swim a distance that would allow them to exit the water safely.

•Children should always be supervised. Whether you're in the backyard, a public pool, or at the beach, make sure there is a responsible, designated person to watch the water when children are swimming. Swim with a buddy. It's a best practice for swimmers of all ages, including adults.

•Avoid alcohol. It impairs your judgment, balance, coordination, and your body's ability to stay warm. Avoid it when swimming and supervising children.

•Enter the water feet-first. Serious injuries—including paralysis—can occur from diving head first into unknown water and hitting the bottom. Enter head-first only when the area is clearly marked for diving and has no obstructions.

•Have a phone handy. No matter where you are swimming, the ability to call 911 in an emergency could be a lifesaver.

•Use only U.S. Coast Guard approved life jackets. Young and inexperienced swimmers may want to use a life jacket. Do not use any sort of air-filled or foam toys. They are not designed to keep swimmers safe.

•Stay away from pool drains. Limbs, hair, or clothing can become entangled if a drain is faulty. If you suspect they may not be functioning properly, ask your pool service provider to inspect them.

•Learn Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). It can mean the difference between life and death. Check with the Red Cross about registering for a CPR class in your area.
