#### CHARGE 2020—MIDDLE SCHOOL EVENT



# HEALTH HIGHLIGHTS

#### PUT CHRIST BACK IN CHRISTMAS!

At Christmas we find joy in our Savior's birthday! How should we celebrate?

Spend time with Him. Come to worship and Advent services. Perhaps an Advent Christmas calendar would help your children and teens (and you as well) focus on the Reason for the Season. Make time for spiritual growth for you and your family.

Celebrate your values. What is most important or worth your time? Rethink ways you spend your time and energy. How do you value your faith, family, friends, activities, food and decorations?

Holidays are stressful. Family Life Radio mentioned a survey where 87% of the respondents felt the holidays were stressful. Guess the #1 stressor? Spending too much money! How can we be good stewards of God's blessings of money and our time?

•Buy fewer gifts. Remember the people who truly need your gifts. For those who seem to "have everything", giving an alternative gift through ELCA World Hunger Gifts—provide clean water, food for AIDS orphans, vaccinations for a child, a goat or other animal to support a family could be an option. Do we need more "stuff"?

•Instead of spending a lot of shopping time, replace it with family time—a movie or reading a favorite story. Be a blessing by visiting someone in a nursing home or veteran's hospital.

•For younger children, too many gifts can be overwhelming. Carefully choose gifts that they will enjoy and appreciate. Often games or toys that they can play or work together with others will encourage camaraderie and create fun memories.

•If you are giving your children money, help them to be good stewards by earmarking some for sharing, some for saving and some for spending.

•Encourage your child/children to share Christ's love and give during the holiday by acts of kindness support a food pantry or serve a meal at a soup kitchen. At Ascension, bring items for the Weekend Food Backpack Program, or household and personal products for family Christmas packages for those in need in our community.

Reduce stress by shopping during off-peak hours when there will be fewer customers in the checkout lines. Shopping on-line can certainly be an option but use only secure sites. Also, with the cold/flu season here, avoiding holiday crowds may mean staying healthy.

Birthdays are for celebrating. The first Christmas was simple—the baby Jesus arriving in the usual way and later sleeping in His mother's arms. A father concerned about his new wife and baby. An innkeeper pondering a miracle of new life in his stable. People from diverse cultures (shepherds, astrologers) came to worship and honor the birth of our King, Jesus. Take some time to worship, honor and celebrate Jesus' birthday today!
