#### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JULIE Dear disciples,

Fluid and nimble—my words of the time. We are facing a time which few of us were prepared. This first week of social distancing and suspension of worship in our church building has been hard to digest, and has taught me I have a lot to learn about technology.



As of today, March 23rd, we have received notification of a "stay-athome order". In response, we understand the need for flexibility and change. As you will see, this is an abbreviated Messenger. When we are able to gather in-person, we will arrange for worship leaders, an updated calendar, and anything else we will need. Until further notice, we will worship together on Facebook. As of now, regular office hours have been suspended. Everything is fluid, and we must be nimble.

We are planning to celebrate Easter on the first Sunday we return as an in-person worship community. I can assure you that the Congregation Council and staff of Ascension are showing their leadership skills in tremendous ways. We are navigating this together, fluid and nimble, and in all things trusting God.

## WE ARE IN THIS TOGETHER

During this time, we are asking that the church, the people of Ascension pull together. We are still a community reaching out to each other and the community, just through different means.

So what can you do?



Worship! We are using the Facebook platform and our Ascension group to post our worship services. I am asking for people who are willing to record themselves doing the readings—we still want to see each other. I know it isn't ideal—but if you have the means, and need help—see if a family member or neighbor could assist you. Now is not the time to "suspend" worship.

Pray! Pray, pray, pray. We have so many things we can pray. Give thanks for what we do have—remember in previous epidemics and challenges, they did not have the resources we have to stay in communication. Pray for our health care workers who are going above and beyond right now. Pray for those who are ill, in facilities or hospitalized, and their families during a time of limited visitation. Pray for the staff, who are experiencing ways of doing ministry that we honestly were not prepared.

Study! Make this a time to prioritize reading scripture and make it a habit. I am beginning to find ways in which we can hold studies and small groups together on line. We started with our Sunday morning adult study and it went well.

Give and Serve! We are still in need of resources to be the church in this community. In addition to helping with worship by reading or prayers, what other ways might you be able to give? Consider making phone calls to church members to check in, sending notes, some have said they could pick up groceries or items needed. Be creative. And yes, financial gifts are important as well.

Encourage! This is not a time to look at everything through a negative eye. Let's be honest, people will let you down! Your government will let you down! Your congregation will let you down! Your pastor will let you down! But I believe all of us are doing our best! We are moving through waters we didn't prepare for and we are not giving up. Exercise love!

Invite! Call someone not part of the congregation and invite them to join us in our virtual worship together. We are church together, and more are always welcome. We got this! God's got this!



## FINANCIAL GIVING

The church will still need financial resources to minister to the community. Even though we are not having worship in person, you can still provide your gifts so that we can continue to serve as we are called.

Online giving—the advantage to online giving is that your gift is deposited directly into our congregation account. It does not need to be counted, and held for deposit.
