### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JULIE

God Shows Up-in unexpected ways and places

In breath blown over the waters. In the voice of a burning bush. On a mountain top. In a whisper. In a storm. In defeat and in victory. To the old and to the young. To the chosen and those we thought were not!



The Christmas narrative is one of the clearest stories where God shows up in unexpected ways. A child is born to a young mother recently betrothed to her husband. The child is born not at home, but while on a journey, in a stable, with farm animals and shepherds as the first to greet the babe.

Do we expect God to continue to show up in unexpected ways—or is that an oxymoron? I wonder if we even expect God to show up anymore.


We are in the midst of another change in how we worship. Returning to online worship because of the increase in cases of COVID, increases in the hospitalization, and deaths related to COVID. Parents, children, youth, and teachers are adjusting again to virtual education and all the complications that come with that. We have been subject to one of the most difficult elections in most of our lifetimes and the disagreements before the election continue to divide. We are faced with strong differing opinions on almost every decision anyone makes. Where is God in all of this? Why isn't God showing up?

This is the season when we are reassured if we open our hearts and minds to the promises of God with the birth of Jesus, God with us. Just as God showed up, broke through the barriers and came to earth that fateful and faithful night, God continues to enter into our lives and world in the unexpected ways. It will not be the celebration we have always done before—and for that I grieve. Much like our Easter celebration that was thwarted, Christmas Eve services will be changed as well. And I don't know when we will worship again together in this place.

What I do know is that we are continuing to worship the God that is with us where we are, in the unexpected ways and places. God is with us in those Zoom gatherings with family, friends, and congregation members. God is with us in the virtual worship. God is with us in our prayers and our waiting as we celebrate this season of Advent. God shows up as we celebrate, whether we celebrate alone at home or with a small family gathering who are in our bubble.

God is showing up in the health care workers who are with those hospitalized or in care facilities when family isn't allowed to visit. God is showing up in the leaders that make difficult decisions they may not like themselves. God is showing up in the phone calls and cards you are mailing. The promise is God is with us—God has shown up—so expect the unexpected!

- Only those legal voting members who attend the meeting may vote.
- Each voting member will need to attend on their own device (computer/phone/tablet).
- For the love our holy master, Mute your microphone until you need to speak! With 30 or more in the meeting it will be chaos if we don't. Look for the microphone symbol on your tool bar at the bottom of your screen and click it off.


### **WORSHIP UPDATE**

#### HOW TO SAFELY CELEBRATE CHRISTMAS ADMIST COVID

Before you get together ponder this: Community levels of COVID-19/ Exposure during travel/Location of gathering/ Number and crowding of people at gathering/ Behaviors of people prior to & during gathering

Before you get together consider this: Your risk factors/ Risk factors of your loved ones/ Celebrating within your bubble- college students returning home are outside your Covid Bubble/ Isolating for 14 days before you get together.

Who's out for the holidays or "Do not host or participate in any gatherings if you or anyone in your home meets the following criteria": Has tested positive for COVID-19 and has not completed self-isolation/ Has symptoms of COVID-19 ( see attached chart and when in doubt stay out) /Has taken a COVID-19 test and is awaiting results/May have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 within the last 14 days/Is at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19.

<u>How to safely host a holiday</u>: Keep it small/Limit it to your "bubble"/ Anyone who is sick, has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or is awaiting the results of a COVID-19 test should stay home/Spread out/ mask up/ Open windows, since being outside on 12/25 in Michigan is typically unrealistic.

## Some ideas on how to not let Covid Ruin the Birthday of Jesus

Use technology-even though Zoom burnout is real, use it and other social media to its fullest/ Light some candles and attend worship remotely and read the Christmas story in the bible together/ Send your gifts early-UPS/ Fed Ex/ USPS are going to be busy/ Share what makes you thankful for each other- hand written notes or phone calls are the best, but post it if you have to/ Sing or listen to your favorite hymns or Christmas songs/ Drive by or walk thru your neighborhood and enjoy the holiday lights/ Share recipes and family traditions together or remotely/ Enjoy the down time-read devotionals, journal, and pray/Decorate the house and cookies together in your bubble/Share joy and love with those less fortunate- distantly of course: spend the money you would normally spend on a fancy gathering with your local food bank or other non-profit.

Get creative! Even though this year Christmas will not be the same for many of us, it is a time to reflect on God's greatest gifts: our health and each other. How many blessings can you name? Go!

If you have the gift of creativity- share it with your Ascension family via Facebook. We are all struggling together to make sense of this change in our normal. We are in this together!

<u>Philippians: 4-6-7:</u> Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.


