The history of our location ... In the mid 1950's, St. John's Lutheran Church in

In the mid 1950's, St. John's Lutheran Church in Saginaw purchased approximately eight acres of land in Thomas Township on the corner of Gratiot and Van Wormer Roads. The plan was to start a mission church west of Saginaw. In 1959 a young pastor, named Jacob Knoedler, was asked to take the challenge and start a mission church. Ascension Lutheran Church had begun in March of 1960. It

was affiliated with the former American Lutheran Church.

The congregation held its first worship service in Grange Hall on December 4, 1960. Grange Hall was located on Lone Road between Geddes and Frost Roads. In January of 1961, worship services were moved to the parsonage basement. The parsonage was located on Van Wormer Road adjacent to the present property. By February 26, 1961, the 140 baptized members of Ascension were formally organized. The original structure was sixty square fee and could seat approximately 130 people in folding chairs. The nave of the church served as a worship area, Sunday School area, and a fellowship hall.

Ground was broken in November 1969 for a new educational and office wing. Much of the work was done by members of the congregation. The new unit consisted of several classrooms, a lounge/kitchen combination and offices for the secretary and Pastor

In January of 1985, an extensive renovation was started in the educational unit to make better use of the space. The Pastor and secretary's offices, bathrooms and kitchen were all moved. The tile floor and folding chairs in the sanctuary were replaced with carpeting and permanent pews. The altar and organ platform were completely remodeled and a choir area and a cry room were created. Work was completed and the remodeled church was dedicated on May 16, 1985.

In the fall of 1996, the Sunday School unit was remodeled. A large library and study room were created, as well as a large gathering area and a new fellowship hall. This project was dedicated in June of 1998.

The congregation had grown enough by the summer of 1999, that an addition to the parking lot was approved. The lot size doubled the parking capacity.

In the spring of 2001, a large garage to store lawn care equipment and maintenance supplies was built on the west side of the parking lot.

In February 2005, the congregation approved the beginning of a major addition and renovation project. A new sanctuary was built and the old sanctuary was transformed into a choir room, youth room, large nursery, and family restroom. At the same time a pavilion complete with kitchen, restroom, and storage was erected on the south side of the grounds. The entire project was completed by the winter of 2005.

Our financial giving has been sustainable as we have increased our tithe to the larger church to 8½% with our goal of reaching 10%. I have to admit, this last year has been exhausting, and I just want it to end. But I also know that God is not calling us to only return to the way it was, but to strain forward to what lies ahead. This has been the topic I have prayed with God for the last several months. We have not reached our goal, but we press on! I encourage you to engage in prayer as well, for our congregation and for help in discerning how you will be part of Ascension.

According to the account from Acts 1, Jesus tells the disciples they must wait here but will receive power from the Holy Spirit. The disciples watch as Jesus ascends, but two men in white robes come and say, "Why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."



At the Ascension, Jesus sort of says, tag, you're it! Jesus promises that we will never be alone, and as the church we are called to continue the mission of Jesus on earth until Jesus returns.

On May 12, the Wednesday before Ascension Day (May 13), our worship will surround the texts we use for Ascension and we will renew our commitment as a people of God, as the body of Christ to the mission of Christ. We're it!


Synod Assembly—May 15, 2021

Confirmation Begins

Confirmation classes have begun with a very small class. Bob and I chose a new program at the beginning of the year but with everything going on, it just never got started. Well, it is now.

Confirmation is a ministry of our entire congregation, not just for the youth and parents of our youth. This new plan for confirmation is intended to be a means of building relationships that equip students, their families and our congregation to integrate the story of God into daily life.

The plan is that:

- Confirmands will engage a simple, accessible way to read the Bible and apply it to real life, in real time, in conversation with people that matter.
- Confirmands will discover gifts and abilities in themselves and others throughout our congregation, becoming part of a tradition of raising up new leaders for faithful ministry and service.
- Confirmands, family and the congregation will find that confirmation is not about graduation from church, rather a movement into full membership, including leadership. Confirmands will walk into deepened Christian faith and relationships of substance.
- Families and other members will discover a renewed commitment to their own discipleship and answers to many questions that were left untouched by their own confirmation experiences. Everyone is renewed.

At baptism, the congregation makes a commitment to help raise you the baptized in the faith. Confirmation is that intentional time set aside for our congregation to do this. During the anticipated two years of confirmation, the confirmand will connect with members of the congregation for conversations about a variety of things. It may be a time to share how you experienced your confirmation classes, or what means the most to you at Ascension. I pray that all members of our congregation will be willing to have these conversations with the youth as they grow in their faith.

We have begun the class that will plan to be confirmed in the spring of 2022—we have some catch up work to do, but we are willing. If you have a youth who will be entering the 6th grade or above in the fall, I encourage you to consider this part of your baptismal calling and promise.



MAY Spotlight! - Worship Volunteers

Each month we spotlight a ministry in the church to educate the membership and to hopefully inspire members and youth to find an interest they can participate in.

Volunteers in worship are vital to providing a smooth-running and enjoyable worship service. Serving in one of these ministries can enrich your faith and connect you with other members.

Sound Board Operator

Sound operators arrive a little early before the service begins to perform sound checks and distribute mics. All you need is a helpful heart and a willingness to learn a few basic elements of the soundboard. The best worship service isn't any good if no one can hear it! You pick your own schedule and sign up for the services that you wish to volunteer. This is a great ministry for our middle and high school age youth, adults, and most serve once a month.

Video Screen Operator

Video screen operators are a critical component of worship as we have almost paperless worship services. The operator starts/stops the announcement slides and controls slides for the worship. They are occasionally responsible for turning the lights on/off/down during specific services. You pick your own schedule and sign up for the services that you wish to volunteer. This is a great ministry for our middle and high school age youth, adults, and most serve once a month.

Readers read two lessons during the service. The lessons are provided ahead of time so they can be reviewed to be familiar with. You can specify a specific service you would like to read at. Schedules are generally done quarterly and depending on the service, you may only read once per quarter.

Prayers of the Church

The prayers of the church are read during the service. The prayers are provided ahead of time so they can be reviewed to be familiar with. The prayer reader is encouraged, but not required, to customize the prayers to include current and local prayers as needed. You can specify a specific service you would like to read at. Schedules are generally done quarterly and depending on the service, you read approximately once a month.

Ushers

Usher teams welcome individuals, couples, and teens to serve in this ministry. Typically an usher group is responsible for one Sunday a month. Usher duties include counting attendance, passing the offering plate, ushering people forward for communion, and serving communion. This important ministry is always looking for people and if you enjoy helping people, this is a great team to join!

Acolyte

Acolytes are generally elementary age and can participate once a parent feels they are responsible to carry the flame into and out of the service. They also assist with offering, communion, baptisms, and extinguish the candles. A specific service can be selected and participation ranges from monthly to bi-monthly depending on the number of Acolytes. One or two acolytes are needed at each service. This is one of the first ministries that our youth participate in and is essential in engaging them in volunteering in the future.

Video Recording

Our 10:30 a.m. worship service is recorded via a video camera in the sanctuary. This recording is then saved and posted on our YouTube channel and linked to our website and Facebook. The camera operator will move the camera between the screen and the Pastor throughout the service. We currently have a primary and backup person in this position and could use a couple more so a schedule could be established.

Altar Guild

The Altar Guild group is a vital part of worship that is behind the scenes. Please see our spotlight in the March Messenger for additional details of this ministry.

Projection Entry

Melissa Albosta is the person responsible for entering the content into the projection software. She enters the lessons and the lyrics of hymns, chooses backgrounds, and adds pictures. This is a critical component that allows the video operator to seamlessly move from slide to slide.

Tracy Aldrich is our cantor leading us in song weekly. Especially during this time

where we cannot sing, this ministry is

essential for us to hear the word through song.

She puts in countless hours practicing and singing annually.

Mindfulness: Be Well: Stay Well

First: Focus on what you CAN control

- Stick to healthy habits—eating well, moderate exercise and adequate rest
- Find and do things that make you happy (Yes, you can—even with COVID restrictions.)
- Find ways to keep your mind and body active
- When watching news or engaged in social media, keep an open mind. What is fact? What is truth? Limit your exposure, if needed





Make a sunflower, which turns its head to follow the sun.

What you need:

- Paper plate
- Yellow marker
- Scissors
- Yarn (black and brown)

What you do:

- 1. Color the entire plate yellow.
- 2. Around the edge, cut out an odd number of triangles. Evenly space the cuts to form flower petals.
- 3. Poke a hole in the plate's center. String black yarn through the hole and over one triangle cut. Tie a knot at the back of the plate.
- 4. Continue looping yarn through the hole and over the remaining cuts. Secure the end. The flower should look like a wagon wheel with black spokes.
