## Faith

A living, daring confidence in God's grace.

When Lutherans talk about faith, we are talking about the relationship God's Holy Spirit creates with us. It's a relationship where God's promise of steadfast love and mercy in Jesus opens us to a life of bold trust in God and joyful, generous service to everyone we know and meet in daily life.

Martin Luther was exuberant when he described the freedom of "a living, daring confidence in God's grace, so sure and certain that believers would stake their lives on it a thousand times." He once wrote, "Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, this faith. It is impossible for it not to be doing good things unceasingly."

Faith convictions expressed as statements of belief flow from this confident trust in God. ELCA Lutherans share in the faith expressed in the Apostles', Nicene and Athanasian Creeds, in the Lutheran confessional writings (collected as the Book of Concord), and in the ELCA Confession of Faith.

At the same time faith does not close our minds to the world and our hearts to others. We continue to listen to the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments. We listen to the witness of others and we watch for the ways God is active in the world around us. Faith opens a place for engaging others in conversation, for seeking the truth, for asking questions and speaking love in word and deed.

Faith is a full life, liberated for a living, daring confidence in God's grace.

## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JULIE:

### Transition

On May 12, we celebrated the Ascension of our Lord. In worship, we were reminded of how Jesus blessed his disciples and while blessing them, he ascended into the heavens.

The disciples had been through quite a few transitions in the three years they followed Jesus, but it had intensified. Just 40 or so days prior, we celebrated Good Friday and the death of Jesus. That was a transition. Then the announcement and reality that Jesus had risen. Another transition. The disciples were afraid, and they locked themselves in a room—another transition. Then Jesus appeared again to them, continued to teach them, and now, here we are with another transition as Jesus ascends into heaven.

Ascension Day is a transition and as Ascension Lutheran Church, we know about transitions. In the sixty years of ministry in this place, our building has transitioned. Pastors have come and gone. Membership has had ebbs and flows with birth, death and people who have moved. In the last year, it seemed like every day was a new transition to deal with.

The book of Acts, the writings of that early church, recounts the Ascension of Jesus. As Jesus is rising into heaven the disciples are gazing up. Two men in white robes appear and say, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Transitions are taking place, and we are not called to stand and gaze into heaven. Transitions also dispense power for the new—a new generation, transformation. Jesus' ascension does not mean that Jesus is absent from the church; as the risen Lord, he provides us with the Holy Spirit. This Spirit of Christ will transform us from passive spectators, gazing and wondering about the fulfillment of hope to active witnesses to Jesus on a global scale. The disciples will be moved from their geographic boundaries and the Word of Jesus Christ will spread to the ends of the earth. It is this transition that begins and sustains the church, until that day when all is fulfilled.

Sixty years ago, members of this community determined that this area needed a place to help spread the message of Christ in the place. We have seen many transitions in our congregation and in our world. Jesus calls us to continue to engage in the world, with the guidance and empowerment of the Holy Spirit until the Parousia, the second coming happens. Throughout history, the church has responded to the needs of the community and world. When we look at the issues our world and community experience, we as the body of Christ are called to engage in Jesus name, to respond reflecting Jesus' teaching in the reign of God.

## *JUNE Spotlight!*

### *Fellowship Hall & Pavilion Rentals*

*Each month we spotlight a ministry in the church to educate the membership and to hopefully inspire members and youth to find an interest they can participate in.*

This month's spotlight is a little different. It isn't a ministry, per se, but it does aid in ministries throughout our congregation by having locations to gather for fellowship.



Our Fellowship Hall and Pavilion include full kitchens and bathroom facilities. The hall includes 2 stoves/ovens, 2 refrigerators/freezers, microwave, large sinks, serving window, and is stocked with silverware, utensils, bowls, hot pads, pans, and lots of prep area. The Pavilion is also well stocked and includes a full kitchen with refrigerator/freezer, microwave, stove/oven, sink, serving window, and plenty of prep area.

#### **Our Fellowship Hall**

We use our fellowship hall for just that, gathering with each other. The hall is used for council and committee meetings, Sunday school, confirmation classes, sewing group activities, health committee activities such as flu shot clinics, blood drives, and classes, Soup Suppers during lent, youth events such as egg hunt/drop, chili cook-off, lock-ins, and celebratory events of the church.



#### **Our Pavilion**

The pavilion gives us a place to gather outside enjoying the beautiful weather, while still having cover. It is used for worship, outdoor summer youth nights, Sunday school, vacation bible school, soccer camp, back to school fair, church picnics, blessing of the pets, garage sale and celebratory events of the church.

In addition to use by the various ministries in our congregation, the Fellowship Hall and Pavilion are available to church members for rental. Members have rented for family reunions, Christmas parties, graduation parties, baby and bridal showers, retirement parties, and wedding receptions; just to name a few.

To rent either facility, please contact the church office. The cost for up to 5 hours of use is a \$75 donation and \$125 for over 5 hours. A refundable security deposit of \$100 must be received. Requests for rental should be made at least one month prior to the event for ease in scheduling. Requests for the current year are first come first served and can begin the first business day of the calendar year.

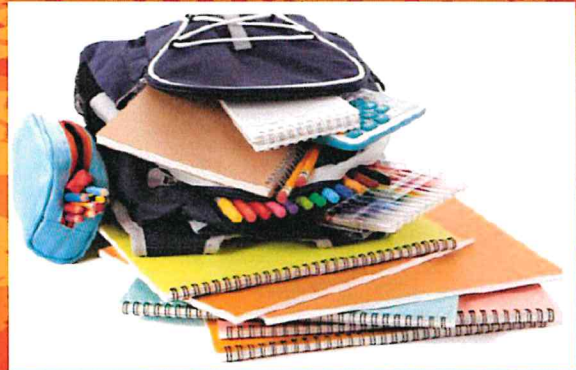

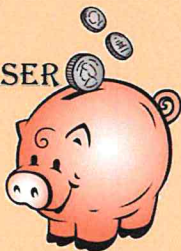

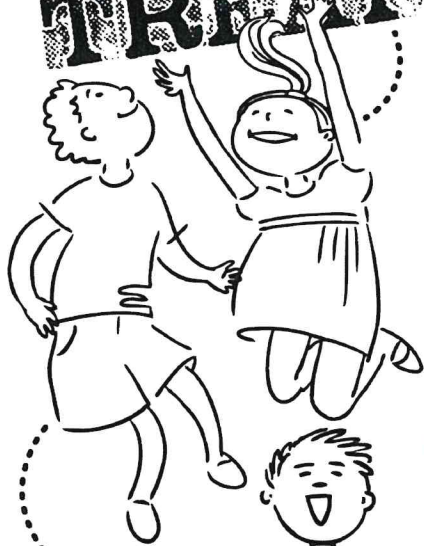

- ¼ cup granola or cereal

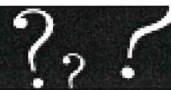
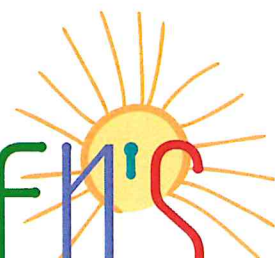
## What you do:


