Luther and Lutheranism Martin Luther (1483-1546)

Martin Luther was eight years old when Christopher Columbus set sail from Europe and landed in the Western Hemisphere. Luther was a young monk and priest when Michaelangelo was painting the Sistine Chapel in Rome. A few years later, he was a junior faculty member at a new university in small-town Germany, intently studying the Scriptures, "captivated with an extraordinary ardor for understanding Paul in the Epistle to the Romans."

In these days Luther was tormented by the demand for righteousness before God. "I did not love, yes, I hated the righteous God who punishes sinners, and secretly, if not blasphemously, certainly murmuring greatly, I was angry with God." Then, in the midst of that struggle with God, the message of the Scriptures became clear, like a long-shut door opening wide. When he realized that a "merciful God justifies us by faith ... I felt that I was altogether born again and had entered paradise itself through open

What Luther discovered is the freedom of Christians trusting God's mercy in Christ. As he later wrote, "Faith is God's work in us. It changes us and makes us to be born anew of God. This faith is a living, busy, active, mighty thing. It is impossible for it not to be doing good works incessantly. Faith is a living, daring confidence in God's grace, so sure and certain that believers would stake their lives on it a thousand times."

This discovery set Luther's life on a new course —both his own life and his public service as a preacher and teacher. When a church-endorsed sales team came to the Wittenberg area in October, 1517, Luther was concerned that the promotion and sale of indulgences undermined the promise of God's unreserved mercy in Jesus and the faith that trusts that promise. His 95 Theses or Disputation on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences became the first of a life-long stream of books, sermons, letters, essays, even hymns in which he expressed his confidence in this life-giving promise from God, the Gospel, and its liberating implications for all of life in church and society.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JULIE:

Gather Us In

I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. -Luther's Small Catechism. Explanation of the Third Article of the Apostle's Creed.

As you may know, the Church follows a liturgical calendar. It begins with the Season of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Season of Epiphany, Pentecost, and we are now in the Season of Pentecost, the longest season of the church year. Some call this the Ordinary Time. Pentecost is when we remember and celebrate the coming of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit into the people and into the church.

Each week we confess "I believe in the Holy Spirit..." Martin Luther wrote in the small catechism the meaning of this confessionthat we cannot come to believe in Jesus without the work of the Holy Spirit. This begs the question-what are the works of the Spirit—call, gather, enlighten, sanctify (make holy, and keep). I believe that the Holy Spirit has been doing this throughout the history of the church, including those times when it has been a challenge.

As the pandemic restrictions are slowly being lifted and more people are being vaccinated, the congregation has returned to gathering in worship, by the power of the Spirit. The Spirit calls us to be a physical community as we are able, to worship and to serve together. Even when we began to gather together, we care about the others so we wore masks, physically distanced, and refrained from singing. We continue our online opportunities for those who were not able or ready to return in person. I think we

did a good job, even if some didn't like it, we showed love for the least of these.

Having said all this, I have a concern. As a congregation, many have gotten out of the habit of coming together in community to worship. We have gotten quite comfortable waking up when we want and watching the video of the worship service. Some might get up and watch live at 8 a.m. but we can eat breakfast and stay in our jammies. I get that temptation! However, it is time to start to consider your return to worship with our community. The Spirit calls us to be a community, to gather us as one body. We Connie Dutcher, Treasurer are the living body of Christ, and that requires active participation, not as a passive spectator.

I pray and encourage you to return to worship as you are able. We will continue our online presence as there will always be people who are away or unable to worship due to health. Wear what you want to Glen Mack, Congregational Care wear-we are not a congregation that you need to dress up for-I would rather have you here in your housecoat than not at all. If you are in the middle of a project, come at 8 before you begin, or take a 30-60 minute break to thank God you are able to do the project. If Sunday's are a challenge, we worship on Wednesday's too.

So Holy Spirit, gather us in!

Here in this place the new light is streaming, now is the darkness vanished away: see in this space our fears and our dreamings brought here to you in the light of this day. Gather us in, the lost and forsaken, gather us in, the blind and the lame: call to us now, and we shall awaken. we shall arise at the sound of our name.

Each month we spotlight a ministry in the church to educate the membership and to hopefully inspire members and youth to find an interest they can participate in.

Communication: the imparting or exchanging of information or news

Communication is one of the greatest challenges and obstacles in any relationship and organization. With Ascension, this is no different. People regularly say they don't know what is going on or didn't know they were scheduled to serve...below is a review of where you can find the information about what is going on in our ministry together.

Worship and participating in activities: Participating in the life of the congregation is a great way to stay in touch with what is happening. There are announcements before worship begins and conversation with others also helps spread the news. The 2021 Messengers have highlighted several areas of the church that desire more participants.



The Messenger: This is our monthly newsletter. This publication provides you the opportunity to see what has been going on, as well as information for upcoming events and who is scheduled to serve during the month. When you read the Messenger, do so with your calendar so you can mark down what you wish to participate in. Print out the calendar and put on your refrigerator. The Messenger is mailed or emailed to you, based on your prefer-NEWSLETTER ences. It is also posted on Facebook and on our website.

Facebook: This is the ongoing information and sharing of information and community news, including the joys and sorrows we share with each other as a community. Here you will also find links to our worship services online, weekly announcements, information that you may find important in your faith life, and updates on events between the printing of the newsletter. It is where we are able to share the most current information.





Ascensionlc.org: This is our website. Here we try to keep you up to date on events occurring in our community, as well as information on worship, education, forms to complete, and information about membership and religious rites. You will also find the calendar of events and a copy of the Messenger if you misplaced the one sent to you.

ascensionlc@sbcglobal.net: This is our email. Please feel free anytime to ask "When am I scheduled to read (or usher or work in sound booth, etc.)?". We can also send many of the church documents, forms and information to you this way. Send an email to the church so we have your address in our system. If we are looking for someone to fill-in to serve, many times this is the fastest way to get that information out to our servers. The church does not send spam or sell your information. Your email address is safe and used only for church related activities.





989-781-2170: Our phone number, although old-fashioned to some, is still a great form of communication. It is not a bother to our day if you call and ask a question or wish to find out some information. It is staffed Monday through Thursdays 9am-2pm, but we do have a voicemail system that will take your message and we can return a call if necessary.
