

## Sunday Study at 9:15 a.m.

Have you ever wondered how a marginal Jesus movement over

2000 years ago in another land became a dominant religious movement in the Western world and continues to grow in areas around the world even today? The sociologist, Rodney Start embarked on a quest to discover just that. What he discovered was that throughout history there was a group of very common, ordinary people who ended up doing uncommon, extraordinary things.

These common, everyday people valued others people looked down upon. When the measles outbreak and small pox wiped out a quarter, up to a third of the population in the Roman Empire, Christ followers not only nursed their own, but also took in those who families cast them out into the streets to die. People flocked to this new community—a community founded on the rare expression of love. Anyone who said "yes" to Jesus' invitation to life was welcomed.

To put it plainly, these early Christians BELIEVED, with their whole hearts. This faith transformed them from the inside out, and their actions toward their family, neighbors, and even strangers and those different from them flowed from them.

This is what it means to believe. Believe is not a passive word, meant to be kept to ourselves as private. To believe is an action word that changes our lives, the lives of others, and ultimately the world.

Adults any youth not in our children's Sunday School, will embark on a 30-week journey to believe. We meet on Sunday mornings between services at 9:15 a.m. Each week in preparation for class you will be encouraged to read one chapter of the book "Believe." We will watch a brief video to prepare us for discussion.

I have purchased some books for those interested. If you are able and desire, you can donate \$5 to offset the cost.






### **Food Distribution In Our Community**



### TO THE ELDER STATESMEN/STATESWOMEN OF THE CONGREGATION

If you are over 72 now, you may want to consider making a charitable contribution from your IRA. Why should you do so? It has favorable tax consequences for you and, more importantly, favorable consequences for Ascension.

As an Elder Statesperson with IRA, you should know that when you hit that magic number of 72 you are required to start taking money out of those IRAs. You also know that those withdrawals come with tax consequences. The money you withdraw is considered ordinary income and will be taxed at rates applicable to your income level. If you want to avoid increasing your taxable income for 2021, you may want to consider making a donation from your IRA directly to Ascension.

The benefit of doing a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from an IRA is that the distribution comes out of the IRA without any of the tax consequences that would otherwise apply to a withdrawal (i.e., it is excluded from income altogether). Notably, there is no charitable deduction for making the QCD contribution to the charity, but only because by definition it was already entirely pre-tax (having come directly from a pre-tax IRA).

In addition, to the extent that the IRA owner had a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) obligation for the year, the QCD is deemed to satisfy the RMD, even though the QCD is not taxable as an RMD otherwise would have been. And since an IRA owner must be age 72 in order to do the QCD, by definition he/she will also have at least some RMD due for that tax year as well! The money needs to be transferred directly from the IRA to the charity in order to be tax-free. If you withdraw it from the IRA first and then give it to the charity, you can deduct the gift as a charitable contribution (if you itemize), but the withdrawal will be included in your adjusted gross income.

Under the QCD rules, the IRA owner must be at least age 72 to do the QCD to the charity (and notably, the IRA owner must actually be age 72 or older on the date of distribution, not merely turning 72 sometime that year).
