A Message From Pastor Julie

Saying Yes to God

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship."—Romans 12:1

I am reading the book, "Seven Basics of Belonging-the Meaning of Church Membership" by Sam Ranier. In it recalls a story of how he once asked his pastor to give him the best definition of worship—to which the pastor responded "Saying *yes* to God." I haven't forgotten those words, and before each service I have led since I read this chapter I have prayed, "Let us all say yes to God."

Worship is a discipleship practice, and is the primary way in which the body of Christ gathers. First and foremost, Ascension is a worshiping community. This distinguishes us from clubs, fellowship groups, or social service agencies. Worship is the beginning of who we are as church. Worship is not just about what we do and experience in a church service; worship is submitting to God's will. As Paul writes to the Romans, we are called to be a living sacrifice. What makes us worshipers of God is not the songs we sing or even how much theology we can expound on throughout the service. What makes us a worshiper of Christ is that we are willing to give God all of who we are. This is our sacrifice; this is our spiritual worship.

How often do we enter the worship service wondering what we will get out of worship or what are we going to get today? Will the songs be the ones we want to sing? Will the pastor give a good sermon, that makes sense, and isn't too long? Will the worship planners fulfill my preferences on music style and everything else?

But worship isn't about getting something from God. Worship is selfless, and our motivation for worship is to be in the presence of God and God's people. One of the greatest challenges of leading a congregation is trying to make people happy—especially in worship. And much of this lies around the music we sing. Some like the contemporary, some want only songs written before 1650 AD. Some want to sing every verse, others wonder why we don't stop at three (though two would be preferable!). It isn't wrong to have preferences, but when we impose those preferences on everyone else, we lose the power of being with the people of God, all the people of God.

What draws us to worship, and what draws us close to God is Jesus. When we enter worship, do we put God in front of everything else, everything else? When we make the effort, the "sacrifice" to come to worship with the community of believers, we are saying yes to God above everything else. God is our priority. Placing anything else or anyone else in front of God will not draw you into God's presence. Saying yes to God is an awareness that together we are with the Spirit of God, we are a community.

The more regularly we attend worship, the more regularly we are in life to say yes to God. It is like exercise, or any other habit we are working toward. The cumulative effect of regular worship makes you strong and healthier. There are medical studies that show that active church members often do better in recovery.

As Lutherans, we often might define our worship as liturgical, meaning the work of the people. Worship is not entertainment, it is the body of Christ together praising God. This means that each of us is to engage in worship and participate. Some of our worship is the same from week to week—try focusing on a specific word or phrase. Maybe pause and listen for a moment. Close your eyes when the readings are being read and hear the Word. If we sing a song you find hard to sing, pay attention to the poetry of the words. When we are praying, engage in the prayer—not just with the congregation response, but really praying for our church, our world, and those in need. Pray for those in leadership that day, or for those around you. Enter into God's presence from the minute you walk into the sanctuary.

Saying yes to God can and will change your life. Paul continues to write in Romans 12:2—
"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of you minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." Plan to see you in worship.

Health Highlights

With our quarterly blood drive coming up on March 24th, I wanted to take the opportunity to discuss this miraculous creation of our Heavenly Father...BLOOD!

As a dialysis nurse I work with A LOT of blood daily. Individuals instinctively seem quite averse to blood, but it there is no human life. Our blood transports needed oxygen, nutrients and hormones to the tissue and organs within our body. Not only does it provide us with what we need, but it takes away what we don't. Blood removes carbon dioxide and other waste products, delivering them to organs such as our lungs, liver, kidneys, and intestine to get rid of. It helps regulate our body temperature and protects us by clotting and fighting off bacteria, and viruses. The list of things our blood does for us is all-embracing. I can't stop being amazed at how God created us!

There is no substitute for human blood. I am asking that we as a congregation make this blood drive in March our most successful yet. The gift of blood helps save lives, and the demand for blood and blood products remains great in our community. Donations are essential not only for trauma patients, but for people experiencing a variety of circumstances, including surgeries, transplants, chronic illnesses, blood disorders, preterm birth, and cancer. We all know someone who has needed blood at some point in their life. We all have an opportunity to save a life just by taking an hour out of our day to donate. MOTIVATING BLOOD DONOR FACTS (provided by Versiti Blood Center)

- The average adult body contains 10 pints of blood.
- ♦ A newborn baby has about one cup of blood in their body.
- The blood in our body makes up about 7% of our total body weight.
- Donating blood burns 650 calories.
- Just one blood donation can save up to three lives.
- ♦ About 37 out of every 100 Americans are eligible to donate blood but only 3 to 4 people donate each year.





New Cards In Pews

We do need members to add their names if the prayer is to be added to the Prayer Chain.



How Do I Access Up-To-Date Church Directory Information At Home?

Ascension Lutheran Church made the decision several years ago to update their contact management system. What is a contact management system you ask? It is a computer program that allows the church to maintain data on its members and visitors. In the "old days" (as my kids like to say) there were paper records, books, index cards, and file cabinet drawers full of files. Today, that information is kept in a computer program and in the cloud. The benefits are quick and easy access to addresses, phone numbers, birthdates, membership information, giving information, and the ministries each person volunteers for.

What can we do with this information? Well for starters, we can generate bulk mailings, giving statements are an example of this. If we need a sound board operator, everyone who is trained has a "tag" and we simply send one email with a click or two that we need help with sound on a specific date. We began capturing attendance information this last year which provides us an accurate count each week for reports. It is a great time saving management tool that allows for an efficient office.

The main advantage for church members is if you have a computer at home or a smart phone in your hand, you can also have access to directory information. Maybe you want to send a get well card, you can see the correct spelling of a member's name as well as their address. If you want to make a phone call, the phone numbers are at your fingertips and up-to-date. In your own profile, you will also be able to see your membership data and giving information (but not that of others).

Many in the congregation already have a login for the system, however the majority are not using it. To gain access, Lisa will need to send you an invite via email or provide you with the login that is already established. The website you access (from your computer) is ascension1.breezechms.com or you can download the Breeze app from the App Store or Play Store. Contact Lisa at the office either via phone or email to ask for the invite/login to get started.

2022 Youth Gathering Cancelled

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) has announced that the 2022 ELCA Youth Gathering has been canceled due to the ongoing pandemic, the recent COVID-19 surge and public health considerations. The Gathering pre-events — the Multicultural Youth Leadership Event (MYLE) and the tAble, the ELCA gathering for youth with disabilities — have also been canceled.

An announcement today from the ELCA Youth Gathering states: "We know there are thousands of young people who will not get to experience the Gathering, and our hearts break for them. This was not an easy decision, and we ask for your prayers and your grace. We understand the impact this decision will have on our youth, volunteers and planning teams, and we hope to return to Minneapolis for a future Gathering."

The announcement emphasized the ELCA's commitment "to supporting the young people of our church and to seeing that the ministry of the Gathering, MYLE and the tAble continue for years to come."

The 2024 Gathering will take place July 16-20, 2024, with the Multicultural Youth Leadership Event (MYLE) and the tAble taking place July 13-16, 2024. The location will be announced this summer.

Our Youth at Ascension are in discussion about a possible alternative event. Details will follow, once a decision has been made.


