A Message From Pastor Julie



The season of Lent is often a confusing time for us in the church. Throughout our worship together there is contrasting imagery—wilderness and parched deserts alongside lush living water.

We began with Ash Wednesday, hearing those jarring word, "remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." It is a reminder not only of our inevitable mortality; it is also a recognition of what is burned out, charred, and used up in our lives. In conversation with people in and outside of the church, there is a sense of exhaustion, dried up emotions, and sometimes a loss of hope.

Contrast this to the living water that is offered to us in Jesus the Christ. It is in the baptismal waters that we can draw hope. In our thirsting and longing for life, Jesus offers it to us as Jesus offers himself to us in the water and in the meal that we celebrate together. The image of water, the sound, taste and coolness is powerful in contrast to the dry patches and wildernesses of our life.

During our season of Lent, worship is paired down, simplified. Our Wednesday worships will focus on Jesus meeting us at the table. Much of the liturgy will be spoken. This offers a time for us to focus on the words, on the hope, on the confession that in our dry and barren lives, we thirst for God in the waters of baptism.

I encourage us all to engage in this season, not as one more thing to do, but just to be! Join us on Wednesday for a little soup and then for an evening of worship and prayer. Welcome Jesus in the waters of life and meet Jesus at the table.

Meeting Jesus at the Table

Stories of food and drink are all through the Bible. Jesus calls himself the bread of life. Jesus feeds the multitudes. Jesus eats with tax collectors and sinners. Jesus offers himself at the Last supper as bread and wine are shared.

Eating sustains our body and eating with others creates community.

During this season of Lent, we will focus on Meeting Jesus at the Table, exploring and meditating on the Bible stories that feature eating and food. You are invited to join us as we eat together with a simple soup supper before worship, share in the Lord's supper where we will use different kinds of bread each week, and hear the message of Jesus in new ways.


Soup Supper Workers

The Center of Hope Food Pantry (formerly SMM Food Pantry) will participate in the annual March for Hunger Drive. All money donated between March 1st and April 30th will be eligible to receive a 10% matching amount. Flyers are available on line and on the kiosk if you wish to donate directly. Please be sure your check indicates Center of Hope FP/Saginaw

and P-981 in the memo line.

Fundraising is vital this year. We are able to serve about 140 families through two pantry days. As we know, groceries are more expensive and even though we get a good discount through the Food Bank, our costs have increased to about \$34/family-but that varies with market prices.

Ascension will have a "Noisy Offering" March 19th through 22nd if you wish to donate through this method, or send your donation directly to the FBEM. We will collect both "Noisy & Quiet Paper Donations".

Wellness Warriors invites everyone in the congregation to get moving during Lent. Join us on our Walk to Jerusalem. We need to collect a total of 3,177 miles to make our imagined trek from Ascension Lutheran Church to Jerusalem.

Did you know walking is mentioned 366 times in the Bible? Our bodies were created for walking. Regular walking can help prevent depression, lengthen our lifespan, lower our stress levels, improve range of motion in our joints, relieve arthritis and back pain, strengthen our muscles and bones, and improve our sleep. This Walk to Jerusalem is a great way not only to improve our physical health through exercise but also improve our spiritual health through prayer, fellowship, and studying of God's Word during this journey together.

What counts? It's not just about walking. There are other opportunities to accumulate mileage towards our journey.

One Mile is equivalent to:

- √ 20 minutes of active household chores
 - Examples: vacuuming, yard work, washing dishes, laundry, preparing meals, cleaning bathrooms, etc. You can combine 5- or 10-minute segments of these activities to contribute to the total.
- 15 minutes of devotion, prayer and Bible reading
- √ 20 minutes of any physical indoor or outdoor activity Examples: swimming, playing soccer, playing basketball, exercise class, etc.
- Attendance of Sunday Services or a mid-week Lenten service
- 20 minutes of community service with a recognized non-profit group
- Attendance at a meeting at church Examples: bible study, council meeting, ministry team meeting, etc.

Two Miles is equivalent to:

- Attendance at Ash Wednesday service on February 22, 2023
- Serving as a Children's Church teacher
- Helping clean-up after Wednesday's Lenten supper or Sunday coffee

Three Miles is equivalent to:

✓ Preparing and/or serving Wednesday's Lenten supper

Walk to Jerusalem packets will be available for pickup starting Sunday, February 19 2023. What's in this packet?

- A personal calendar for you and your family to track daily activities Ash Wednesday thru Palm Sunday.
- Mileage slips to complete weekly. Please clip and stuff in the "mileage envelope" located on the Parish Health office door. Alternatively, you may submit your name and weekly miles by Sunday of each participating week to the parish health committee email at ALCParishHealth@gmail.com.

The Parish Health Committee will tally these miles and mark our progress as a congregation on a world map located within the narthex. Our projected route begins here at Ascension Lutheran Church across Ohio, Pennsylvania and New York to JFK Airport where we "board a plane" to cross the Atlantic Ocean to Amsterdam. From there we journey across the European continent to the Middle East until reaching Jerusalem. This journey as planned is approximately 3,177 miles (not counting our flying miles and a ferry ride). Don't be intimidated by the total mileage. Remember, we are traveling as a congregation and all participant miles are accumulated and tracked weekly to help us reach our destination by Palm Sunday.

Generosity of Time and Talent



Their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. ~ 2 Corinthians 8:2

Generosity—liberal in giving, marked by abundance.

Being a good steward of the abundance God has given us is not just about giving money. In many ways, money is easier to give; and yes, it is still needed for ministry. Carrying out the gospel with our time and talent can be just as challenging with the demands of everyday life. It is a challenge to be TIME & TALENT SURV available or commit to something at the church when you don't have time, or you already feel overworked and overcommitted to everything else.

We may wonder how much time is going to be needed. What can I offer? Will I be stuck doing this forever? The reality is when each one of us pitches in, the work is not that difficult. And the time it takes depends on what it is you want to do. Some teams are short lived, sometimes it is just performing a service when needed, some leadership roles are necessary to commit to for a period.

We can't be the church we believe God is calling us to without resources. Even if we had all the money in the world, it would probably not be faithful stewardship to hire someone to do all our ministry. Some people are serving in ways that save us money so it can be used in other ways. Imagine if we paid people to do the lawn care? Imagine if only two people said they would mow? Instead, we have had 10 people who rotate and only mow every 5 weeks and do a great job because they take pride in maintaining our grounds for the community. We have teachers for children's church because they feel it is an important ministry. We can offer three services for worship because people use their time and learn the talent of using the sound board or video operation. When we choose not to give of our time and talent, we can't offer what we already do, and we are stuck not being able to offer new ministries.

For instance, we want to do a directory. Are you able to do some photography, with a phone?

Will you serve in one of the many ways we need worship leaders? Children's church? Counting money? Serve on a leadership or financial team? Work with youth? Offer special music? Visit people in their homes? What special skills do you have to offer?

We have developed a new time and talent sheet. Each of us are requested to complete—not with just what we are already doing

but with those things we might be interested in doing. This information will be inputted into our database for leaders to use when we are looking for someone to serve in a special way.


Endowment

They are doing this in two ways:

- Scholarships for applicants age 16+, who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan.
- Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area.

Challengers: This camp is for confirmation students and Middle School students. It provides an opportunity to bond as a group as well as experience the camp.


Servant Hearts: This camp is for grades 8-12 and is for High School Students.
