Gospel: John 12:1-8

¹Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. ²There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. ³Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. ⁴But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, ⁵Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor? ⁶(He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) ⁷Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. ⁸You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."

Sermon

Hymn of the Day: "Holy Woman, Graceful Giver" (ACS 1002) (video)

Holy woman, graceful giver, prophet, servant, and believer, Mary with the ointment jar, sought the Christ, by scorn undaunted, knelt in love, his feet anointed for his coming burial hour, for his coming burial hour. How the fragrance filled the dwelling! How the act of beauty welling blest all those within the place! How the act of pure devotion, whisp'ring of his coming passion, blest the heart of Christ with grace, blest the heart of Christ with grace!
