#### A Message From Pastor Julie



Revelation 3: 14-16: What is our spiritual temperature?

"And to the angel of the church in Laodicea write: The words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the origin<sup>[a]</sup> of God's creation: <sup>15</sup> "I know your works; you are neither cold nor hot. I wish that you were either cold or hot. <sup>16</sup>So, because you are lukewarm and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth. "

If Jesus took our spiritual temperature, what would he find?

I was reading a blog I read from time to time and this post began: "The American Church is at a crisis moment." (Sam Ranier) I wasn't shocked by the statement so much—we know this. Our attendance has not returned to pre-covid numbers, we have more open slots to fill in our worship leadership, we often ask what ever happened to.... It's not a new phenomenon—event after Jesus ascended into the heaven the disciples just stood there looking up, until two men came and told them to get going. (Acts 1:10-11).

Apathy, the lack of enthusiasm is rampant, not only in our churches but I would say we can see it in many aspects of our daily lives. Because my community is primarily church related, I see it in many facets of the church, at the congregational, synodical, and churchwide levels. It is a why bother, why does it matter kind of approach. And the reasons are varied!

The problem with apathy is that long term the effects are deadly, literally. We can be apathetic about it because we trust that the church will always be there. We don't need to participate, or give, or even attend—others are doing that for us so when there is a need, the congregation will be there. In our synod alone, I would guess that 20 plus ELCA congregations thought the same thing—and now they are not there!

What can we do? That depends on the reason. For some, we have just gotten out of the habit. Right after the pandemic some people told me they like watching worship in their pajamas. I did too! But worship isn't a spectator sport—worship is interactive. We sing, pray, move, and reflect together. When we get out of the habit, or place things in our schedule we deem more important for a time, we find it harder to return. It is even more difficult to return after a death, illness, or situation that upset us. It takes intentionality and discipline.

Get involved. Help out with something in worship. Many people are needed to worship together-from readers, prayers, altar guild, acolytes, sound board and video operators. Become part of worship by helping in leadership!

Are you concerned about raising the next generation? Consider a rotation with Children's Church or helping with the youth. You don't have to be a parent! The more adults involved in a child's formation has been seen as valuable.

Find something you are interested in. Is there a ministry that interests you? Try it out. If it isn't what you thought it was, it isn't a lifelong commitment. Do you see a need we aren't doing and you would be interested in doing this? Consider starting a new ministry. We recently saw this as members of our congregation began a grief support group.

The Lord will always be there. This is true! Jesus isn't going anywhere. But the same can't be said for congregations. Sorry to say, we too will die. But let us do our best until that day to live to the fullest. To be faithful and present in our community. And I want to invite you to be part of the enthusiasm and joy of living a life in faith with the people of Ascension Lutheran Church.

Problem is, that kind of compartmentalization can leave us feeling a bit dissatisfied and insignificant.

### St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were stablished by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two ways:

- Scholarships for applicants age 16+, who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan. DUE BY 7/31/23
- Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area. AWARDED QUARTERLY

The applications for both are posted on the Kiosk at church and available on our website.

Our Weekend Food Bags outreach program was recently awarded a **\$7,000 Grant** from the St. John ELCA Legacy Foundation of Saginaw. **THANK YOU** to the committee for helping us provide food to elementary youth in the Hemlock, St. Charles and Swan Valley school districts!

#### Library Team



At the request of the library team, the church council approved a change in the library use policy. The new policy states: "Materials (books, puzzles, magazines, media, etc.) may be borrowed for a reasonable amount of time and returned or replaced with material of equal use and value. No individual monitoring system needs to be used".

In other words, materials do not have to be "checked out". Just borrow what you wish and return it when you are finished with it. This makes our library a true "lending library".

The team is also in the process of re-organizing materials. A new section called "Emotional Support" is being added. This will include materials for physical, practical, and emotional support for people and caregivers in times of crisis. The support includes materials for those suffering from cancer, dementia, and personal grief. Some really great materials have

been donated. If you have any materials that may help and you wish to donate them, drop them off in the donation box in the library. Thank you again for all the great support given to the library.

#### **Contact Information**



Do you have a method or someone that can contact extended family or friends in case of an emergency?

Breeze (the church data management system) has a place where it can store contact information. Contact Lisa in the office and she can add it to your account. The information is kept private so that only authorized staff is permitted to view the name, relationship to you, and contact phone numbers. The emergency contact will only be utilized if the church is unable to communicate with you over an unusual amount of time. An example of a phone call might include *"This is Pastor Julie Bailey, I haven't been able to reach Lisa Whelton and she hasn't been at church the last few weeks so wanted to check-in and make sure everything is ok"*.

Anyone who lives alone, especial if the rest of the family is out of the area should take advantage of this service.

### Confirmation Classes begin in September

Confirmation Class Al



All youth, 6<sup>th</sup> grade and above who are interested and ready to begin confirmation classes will begin in September. Please let Pastor Julie know if your youth will be participating. The last couple years, the class met every other Sunday at 5 p.m. We can continue that time or move it if that would be helpful. I know some have another commitment on Sunday's so if moving to 4:30 p.m. would help, we can do that.

Confirmation is a church program that delves deeper into the faith in which we baptize. At the completion of the two-year program, the youth are invited to Affirm their Faith. Once the youth has been confirmed, they are a voting member of the congregation, with all the rights and responsibilities of other voting members in the congregation.

### Pop Can Fundraiser



The <u>youth of all ages</u> continue to collect bottles and cans as a fundraising event. Cans and bottles are dropped off at the vestibule near the fellowship hall. Youth sign up for a week at a time to return the cans, and return the money to the church. Half of what is returned goes into their own personal account to be used for youth events. The other half goes into the Youth Savings account to be used for overhead and help pay for events as well.

The money raised can be used to help subsidize camp fees, youth events like Charge or Michigan's Adventure, or the ELCA Gathering in 2024. It is never too early to start saving for these events.

Youth Instructions:

- 1. Sign up on the kiosk to return cans for an open week
- 2. Grab the cans when you are at church that week
- 3. Return the cans at a local store

4. Put the cash in an envelope marked Youth Pop Cans with your name on it and give to Pastor Julie or leave in the church office **no later than the next week.**
