## A Message From Pastor Julie

We need to start with WHY!

We don't have enough money. We don't have enough people. We need to do more advertising. These are the reasons why we can't do anything, or so I'm often told—and it is said not just at Ascension, but in almost every congregation, at least by some, and probably in many businesses.

As I was doing some research, I came across a TED talk from 2016. It is a talk by Simon Sinek, who was explaining why he believed some innovations took off and why some didn't. One of his examples was Samuel Pierpont Langley, one of the most esteemed scientists of the early 1900's and a rival to Orville and Wilbur Wright. He was the one to watch in building the great "flying machine." He received governmental funding, he had the best engineers ready to help, and the news media followed his every move. He had the funding, he had the people, and he was getting marketed. Imagine his success, the financial rewards, the fame, if succeeded.

At the same time, Orville and Wilbur Wright were using money they earned from their bicycle business to try and invent a flying machine. They didn't have the financial resources, or the educated engineers, and no marketing strategy. Instead they saw something that might change the world.

We know who succeeded—the one without enough money, the one that didn't have the people, and the one with no advertising. Langley quit the day he heard of the success of the Wright brothers.

Sinek suggests that one of the reason the Wright brother's succeeded is they began with why. The why—they wanted to make a change in the world. How—by challenging and refusing to give up. The what—the beginning of air travel. Langley may have had the why, how, and what—but in a different order—what, make a flying machine; how, by assembling the best engineers; why, fame and money.

Some may wonder what this has to do with the church, with Ascension.

We are good at figuring out what to do? And we do some really great things. We are strong in outreach, we worship with three services, we offer youth programming, etc. How we do it is through the generosity of disciples, who give of their time, talent and possessions. Why do we do it? For some it is butts in the pews, we need more money, we want more people, we need to survive.

Let's flip it—why do we do what we do? Let's think about this. We could just reverse the direction and say to get butts in the pew and to survive. But is that really the case?

I believe the why is because of Jesus—we love Jesus and this is how Jesus invites us to be part of his life—to make disciples, to love God and love one another, to love because God first loves us. To feed the hungry, clothe the naked... Why—because we are disciples of Jesus Christ. We want others to know the joy of the love of Jesus. How do we do this? We boldly make Jesus known, we tell the story. We do this in worship, in service, in our daily lives. And what do we do, we share, we tell, we feed, we clothe, we love. I believe it is then that we will see the growth of ministry in people, in dollars and in serving. We need to be committed to the why, not the what. Let's start with why!

#### Connecting Sunday to Monday

You may have heard someone talk about being called into ministry and thought to yourself how nice it must be to know with certainty that you have been called. Many of us don't have that sense of God's calling on our lives. Consequently, we tend to divide life into what we can do to make a living and what we do to make a difference. Problem is, that kind of compartmentalization can leave us feeling a bit dissatisfied and insignificant.

What if you had a sense of calling about the roles you play every day – parent, child, worker, homemaker, neighbor, community leader, volunteer – a sense that God has uniquely chosen you and given you a mission right where you are in those roles? Then each of your life's roles would be more than work, it would be your call. But it starts with knowing how God has made you, what God is up to in the world, and your part in it.

Connecting Sunday to Monday focuses on how congregations can transform, one member at a time. This transformation isn't measured by growth in numbers but rather by the change that takes place in the lives of people as they begin to understand God's call on their lives – to use their gifts, talents and abilities to serve God's world.


## Servers Needed During Worship

## St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were stablished by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two

- Scholarships for applicants age 16+, who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan. DUE BY 7/31/23
- Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area. AWARDED QUARTERLY

The applications for both are posted on the Kiosk at church and available on our website.

## Library Team

Library

At the request of the library team, the church council approved a change in the library use policy. The new policy states: "Materials (books, puzzles, magazines, media, etc.) may be borrowed for a reasonable amount of time and returned or replaced with material of equal use and value. No individual monitoring system needs to be used".

In other words, materials do not have to be "checked out". Just borrow what you wish and return it when you are finished with it. This makes our library a true "lending library".

The team is also in the process of re-organizing materials. A new section called "Emotional Support" is being added. This will include materials for physical, practical, and emotional support for people and caregivers in times of crisis. The support includes materials for those suffering from cancer, dementia, and personal grief. Some really great materials have been donated. If you have any materials that may help and you wish to donate them, drop them off in the donation box in the library. Thank you again for all the great support given to the library.

## **Contact Information**



Do you have a method or someone that can contact extended family or friends in case of an emergency?

Breeze (the church data management system) has a place where it can store contact information. Contact Lisa in the office and she can add it to your account. The information is kept private so that only authorized staff is permitted to view the name, relationship to you, and contact phone numbers. The emergency contact will only be utilized if the church is unable to communicate with you over an unusual amount of time. An example of a phone call might include "This is Pastor Julie Bailey, I haven't been able to reach Lisa Whelton and she hasn't been at church the last few weeks so wanted to check-in and make sure everything is ok".

Anyone who lives alone, especial if the rest of the family is out of the area should take advantage of this service.


