A Message From Pastor Julie



God Comes in Unexpected Ways

"For us and for our salvation Jesus came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human."—Second Article of the Nicene Creed

Was incarnate. I would probably say Jesus IS incarnate—the embodiment of God in the flesh. We know from the gospel of John that God sent Jesus to the world for the sake of the world, in love for the world.

God often comes to us in unexpected ways. God came to Moses in a burning bush. God comes in the silence. We are preparing to welcome God coming in human flesh some 2000 years ago. But not as what we might imagine as a 'god', not as someone powerful, mighty, warrior—though like they were hoping and expecting then, we might hope for now—certainly then the world could be taken back from all the evil around us!

God came to the world in an unexpected way—as a baby of a young mother and carpenter. He was born not with the best doctors around but in a barn, greeted first by animals and shepherds. Yet even as a baby, Jesus was a threat to the status quo. His parents had to flee, immigrate for Jesus' safety to Egypt. Not only were the religious of the day concerned about how the message was "changing" but the politicians and secular leaders were also concerned. As Jesus grew, his teaching and example modeled a new way of being; a way of love and invitation for all. A way of peace, community, of transformation.

Jesus is still a threat—a threat to the church and the traditions and ways we have regulated church of who is welcome and who is not. A threat to some of the ways we have always done things. Jesus is a threat to a political system that thrives on power, authority, name-calling, self-centeredness, wealth, and control. Jesus tells us there is a better way, a Jesus-way, and that isn't just for churchy things, but for every aspect of our life.

We want God to intervene, Jesus to do something-and in the same breath we say that the church needs to stay out of politics. What if the unexpected way Jesus comes to us today is incarnate today is in you? What if you are the one whom God has sent, we are the ones whom through the power of the Holy Spirit, with the example and giftedness of the Holy Spirit are called to lead, through example and action to be the change the world needs, to be the change God is calling? I think I will leave it there for you to sit with, pray with, listen with... And be prepared, God comes in unexpected ways!!

I thank my God...



"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now." -Philippians 1:3

To Paul I say 'ditto.' I do thank God every day for this opportunity to serve as the called pastor with Ascension Lutheran Church. You have over and above with appreciation and I do appreciate it. The notes, cards, Facebook posts, gift cards, and the understanding that even though I live in Michigan and call this home, Nebraska still holds a special place in my heart.

We do this ministry together, and I am thankful for the time that we have tried something new without a lot of resistance and with hope. We had to make some radical decisions during part of my ministry, and there were some dark times during the pandemic when I wondered if anything I was doing was worth anything. I thank you for all of that! I thank you for coming back to worship in person as you are able. I give thanks for the continued efforts to be progressive in our ministry, remembering what lies behind, but pressing on toward our goals together.

Ten years—that is a long time for a pastor to stay at one church. I looked up the average for the ELCA and it seems to be about six to eight years. When people join our congregation, they often ask how long I plan on staying. My answer has been until I or the congregation feel it is time for me to move on for the sake of mission. That is still my answer. Unless the congregation tells me different, we have more in us together. With God's leading and guiding, and our foundation of Jesus Christ, I hope to have several more years serving with the people of Ascension.

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study


Beginning on January 7, 2024 our Sunday morning adult class will begin a six-week study titled Self-Esteem: Made in the Image of God. All are welcome.



The theme for our gathering focused around Matthew 5, the Beatitudes—blessed are the..... The Rev. Once again the camp is "All Pricing," meaning you determine what you are able to pay: Full price/Half price/Nothing. All are invited and money should never be an obstacle.




