A Message From Pastor Julie

The Power of Thanks

I want to thank the congregation again for the appreciation of our service together these last ten years. The gift cards, the snacks, the surprises were so amazing. Mostly, thank you for showing up. I am not one who thinks I need a lot of recognition for what I do, I would rather thank you and draw attention to our ministry together. Having said that, I surprisingly found myself more energized and excited for our ministry together.

I've shared that so often we spend our time complaining about things we don't like-it is our culture. We have a bad meal or bad service and we complain—a lot of times on social media for everyone to see. Even at church I hear the negatives of not liking that hymn, how the lighting in the sanctuary is, we need more people and money, I like it better when you wear the robe, no on reads the newsletter, there aren't any kids in worship, the kids are too loud in worship, and so on. I know that there is thankfulness every week in ministry, and it is sometimes nice to hear it.

I know people who are serving also like to be thanked. Whether it is

reading, filling food bags, putting together the newsletter, counting money, serving on council, working as sound or video operator, setting up communion, teaching—whatever it is, they aren't doing it for the thanks or recognition—but it is sometimes nice to hear.

When I was writing the thank you notes, I also realized how meaningful it was to think of each of you as I wrote them. Being thankful can be just as meaningful as being the one thanked.

In a Forbes article, I found "7 Scientifically Proven Benefits of Gratitude that will Motivate you to Give Thanks Year-Round" were these reasons:

- 1. Gratitude opens the door to more relationships. Loving God and loving our neighbor is all about relationships.
- 2. Gratitude improves physical health. The report says that people who practice gratitude experience fewer aches and pains and report feeling healthier.
- 3. Gratitude improves psychological health. Being grateful reduces those toxic emotions ranging from envy, resentment, frustration, and regret.

- 4. Gratitude enhances empathy and reduces aggression. People who are grateful are less likely to retaliate, even if given some negative feedback. They also experience more sensitivity and empathy toward others.
- 5. Grateful people sleep better. They suggested spending 15 minutes writing down some grateful sentiments before sleep. (I think I have suggested that before.)
- 6. Gratitude improves self-esteem. We can appreciate other people's accomplishments without being jealous or resentful.
- 7. Gratitude increases mental strength. Being thankful fosters resilience, even in the worst times of our lives.

Being thankful is not just for Thanksgiving or the holidays. Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." May we enter into this 2024 New Year giving thanks continually!


February 5th—19th: Social Issues Freestyle: Digging into personal concerns and social issues of your choice and studying the Bible verses to guide us through.

Bishop Satterlee's Newsletter

Ground Everything in the Good News of Jesus Christ

"What is your most important or meaningful story about Jesus today?" I ask myself this question to close every day. Sometimes I am flabbergasted by what story or saying floats into my mind. For example, on the Friday after Thanksgiving, the news was filled with the hostage exchange in Israel and Gaza, hate speech on college campuses and at Black Friday shopping centers, and the unending political division in our country. I was anticipating Christ the King Sunday, when we hear Jesus say, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters mine, y o u did me" (Matthew 25:40) and that evening I heard Jesus saving, "I was maligned and you spoke up for me. I was threatened and you stood up for me."

Of course, Jesus never said this

but that is when a saying attributed to Jesus floated into my mind: "So, because you are lukewarm and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth" (Revelation 3:16). I know how hard our rostered ministers try to remain balanced and to not give offense. For a while now, I have wondered where the line is between caring for all God's people and being lukewarm to Jesus. I suspect we are going to find out. I am convinced (perhaps I am afraid) that 2024 will be a year in which the church will not have the luxury of remaining lukewarm. The church will not get away with remaining neither cold nor hot. Some will call upon the church to be hot: others will demand the church be cold. It would be so much easier if we were all of one mind. But we are not.

Less important than where we end up on any issue is how we ground it in the good news of

Jesus Christ. Therefore, we all become confident and comfortable speaking of Jesus in ways that directly address life in this world. Speaking of Jesus may lead some to be hot and others to be cold. What's important is that we speak of Jesus and offer good news that matters. I am not assigning us more to do. I am realizing that the wisdom of what we have been doing since our last synod assembly will likely become apparent in 2024. My advent prayer is that God will bolster those sharing the story of Jesus, and that the spirit will inspire more of us to join them. A way to start might be closing your day by asking yourself, "What is your most important or meaningful story about Jesus today?"


Bishop Satterlee's Sabbatical

Youth Fundraising—Pop Can Returns

Thank you for bringing cans and bottles in to help support Youth Ministry in our congregation.



Individual youth (elementary, middle, and high school) are encouraged to sign up to return cans each week. The next week, youth return the MONEY

from that return to the church office or Pastor Julie. One-half of the money returned goes into that youth's

individual account to help pay for camp, retreats, or other events that require a financial fee. The other 50% supports the youth ministry as a whole. We use this money to help offset costs of events and provide events at a lower cost.








Geodes look plain on the outside but contain beautiful crystals. Create these "rocks" to show how God makes us new on the inside.

What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton
- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush



What you do:

- 1. Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- 2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- 3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- 5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.


