#### A Message From Pastor Julie With: A Preposition of meaning

A preposition is a word and almost always a very small, very common word that shows direction, location, or time, or that introduces an object.

Common Prepositions: to, with, for, on, by, because, since....

These prepositions are not interchangeable. For instance, when people ask me where I serve as pastor I could answer:

- I serve AT Ascension Lutheran Church, Or,
- I serve WITH Ascension Lutheran Church.

To me, each one means something a little different.

AT-This implies that there is a specific place I work or serve. However, the church is not a building and I often find myself at work in homes, hospitals, schools, coffee shops, funeral homes, etc.

WITH-This is the preposition I choose to use because I believe it is biblical and consistent with the calling of a pastor. Paul writes it this way in Romans 12:4-8: *"For as in one body we have many members, and not all the*  members have the same function, 5so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we members are one of another. <sup>6</sup>We have gifts that *differ according to the grace* given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith: <sup>7</sup>ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; <sup>8</sup>the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate. in cheerfulness." I serve for this time with the people of Ascension, bringing mv gifts to accompany and serve alongside the gifts of others. My call specifically is to preach; teach; carry out ministry in accordance with the ELCA constitution; study; provide communion and baptism; to love, serve and pray for God's people; and live by my example giving faithful witness to the world. I love serving with the people of Ascension and we are a gifted group of people. I could go on and on.

What if "with" doesn't just apply to me?

- I am a member AT Ascension Lutheran Church, or
- I am a member WITH

Ascension Lutheran Church

AT—This implies that your membership is at a specific place. But ministry and serving God happens in variety of places. It might also imply that you are a member of this place that offers specific duties as a member, like a club or another organization. Some believe you have to be a member at to get the benefits—for a church that might mean a wedding, funeral. baptism. or whatever it is that is asked for.

WITH-This is the preposition I think applies. We are all members with Ascension, with our varying gifts. There is an understanding that with others, we will walk with, accompany and participate together in the ministry.

What would our congregation look like or be like if we all understood our membership WITH Ascension?

But maybe this contradiction

will be a reminder of the beauty of the Lenten season. Lent is a time when we are invited in to a time of reflection and repentancenot for a self-improvement goal such as a New Year's resolution. Rather we enter into reflection and repentance for the love and transformation of God's world-our lives and the lives of others. This is one of the reasons some choose to give up something for Lent; and others choose to add a good practice into their lives at this

time.

What might you do in love for God. neighbor and world that will show our commitment to being a follower of Jesus, and change the world at the same time? Last year, the ELCA Young Adult group encouraged people to give up single used plastics, as a way to show our care for the creation God has entrusted to us. ### St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process complete began to the transformation of the trust into a foundation. ### From the Synod Office

Sab • bat • i • cal: A Rest or Break from Work

"Moreover I gave them my Sabbaths, as a sign between me and them, so that they might know that I the Lord sanctify them" (Ezekiel 20:12)

This message comes to you as Bishop Satterlee is enjoying the first month of a well-deserved 3-month sabbatical planned with the full encouragement and support of Synod Council in accordance with the synod's sabbatical guidelines for all rostered ministers. A link to the 2024 Compensation Guidelines is provided on the synod website for reference (see Appendix C for the sabbatical guidelines).

*What is a sabbatical?* A sabbatical (from the Hebrew šabat or sabbath; Latin sabbaticus; and Greek sabbatikos) is an extended period of time intentionally spent on things like study, travel, rest, renewal, personal development, reinforcement and rejuvenation of relationships with God and others – activities outside of the routine job that take place without the demands and stress of daily responsibilities.

Why are sabbaticals a blessing for our rostered ministers? Many parishioners believe the call of a rostered minister is relatively stress-free, with the primary focus centered on weekend worship and related activities. In reality, pastors and deacons across our synod work tirelessly throughout each week to meet the strategic needs of their congregation(s) – including worship leadership, education and Bible studies, service projects, community support and the like. In addition, we rely on our pastors to serve as our "shepherds" during congregational conflict, during our more personal events such as baptisms, weddings, funerals, and as they provide 24/7 pastoral care and counseling in times of need. At the synod level, the bishop also serves as "shepherd" to rostered ministers (pastors and deacons) across the synod. Since the pandemic, there has been an enhanced need to help these leaders manage conflict within their congregations along with the feelings of sadness, hurt, anger and frustration that have resulted within their ministries. Our rostered ministers are honored to serve in their calls and they are committed to the important work they lead. Each do their best to manage the inherent stress that builds up as they deal with the mentally challenging and emotionally exhausting deep, "inner soul" issues we put before them week after week, month after month, and year after year. A periodic sabbatical provides a blessed opportunity for our rostered ministers to step away and renew, refresh and recharge for the work to come.

*How frequently are sabbaticals recommended?* It is up to the Congregation Council (or equivalent leadership body) to set the schedule for sabbatical leaves for their rostered ministers to meet the needs of the organization. According to our synod's Compensation Guidelines, a sabbatical of up to three months in duration is encouraged for full-time rostered ministers who have been in their present call five years or more, with continued eligibility for additional sabbaticals within the same call every five years after that. From a financial standpoint, salary, housing and other benefits are expected to continue throughout the sabbatical period with the congregation taking full responsibility for alternative staffing to cover needs during the absence.

With all of this in mind, I encourage you to think about the stressors being managed, both outwardly and inwardly, by your pastor(s) and/or deacon(s). Are there ways you can provide additional support within their on-going ministry to help alleviate known stressors? Is your congregation supportive of sabbaticals for rostered ministers and is a schedule in place for long-range planning? Your encouragement and support of and advocacy for this meaningful break from ministry will mean the world to your rostered minister and to your congregation in the long run!

Make this heartfelt craft as a decoration or gift. What you need: • Yarn Scissors • Parchment paper Baking sheet • Heart-shaped cookie cutters • <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup cornstarch • 1/2 cup water Adult help

#### What you do:

- 1. Cut yarn into 12-inch pieces.
- 2. Place cookie cutters atop a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- Combine cornstarch and water in a saucepan. Heat mixture over medium heat, stirring until thick and smooth. Remove from heat and cool to form a "glue."
- Dip each piece of yarn into the mixture to coat completely. Squeeze off any excess.
