Sunday Adult Study



We will begin meeting **September 8th at 9:15 a.m.** and will be doing a study on the gospel of Luke.

The gospel of Luke invites the reader to explore the story of Jesus and his mission as the Messiah, God's chosen one. It is from Luke we hear the primary narrative of Jesus' birth to the stark images of his crucifixion. Luke describes how God has broken into the world by sending Jesus. We will not study all of the gospel of Luke in class, and yet this is a good time to commit yourself to reading the parts we don't study together.

We will begin Year C of our Lectionary cycle (the three year preaching cycle) in December as the new church year begins with Advent. Luke will be the central gospel in this year's lectionary.





The Unstuck Church: Equipping Churches to Experience Sustained Health


I have been reading this book and find that this might lead to good conversation as a congregation as we move forward in our mission from God.

Ascension's Grief Support Group will begin a new session on **Monday**, **September 9th at 10:30 a.m.** The program they follow is called Grief-Share.

A GriefShare support group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Through this 13-week group,

you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability—and gain solid support each step of the way. **Participant books are \$20.**

If you have book from a previous session, you may use that book again for future sessions. We do have several people who have attended the sessions multiple times and have found them beneficial as each time they are in a different place with their grief.

There are no requirements to share, no pressure, and everyone is welcome! This is not just a group of people from Ascension, it is open to the community, so feel free to share with anyone you know struggling with grief.

Confirmation Classes Begin Sunday, September 8th 4:30 p.m.—6:00 p.m.

Confirmation classes for grades 6 and up will resume September 8th. The Second year students will resume with Pastor Julie as we discuss the Lord's Prayer, Sacraments, Worship, Stewardship, Vocation and other important aspects of discipleship.

First year students will explore the Ten Commandments and the Apostle's Creed. They will be taught by Stephanie Becker.

After a two-year exploration, which includes classes and other activities, the young person will affirm their baptism, hearing again the promises that God makes and committing to their own baptismal responsibilities.

Classes generally begin in the 6th grade, but if older young people wish to join, they are welcome.

Please let Pastor Julie know if you are planning on having your youth join us for confirmation. It is a commitment on both the part of the youth and parents.






