
Message From Pastor Julie

God's ImPossible Promise of Enough

God's promises are at the core of the witness of Scripture, but often we live in the in-between, liminal space between the anticipation of what might be possible and the

inheritance of God's goodness.

As we intentionally engage in stewardship this fall, we will explore the Impossible Promise of Enough. Even though we confess that Jesus will provide for all our needs, we struggle grasping that there will be enough. We lose trust, faith, and hope. During this time we will explore the Impossible promise of Generosity, the Impossible Promise of Safety, and the Impossible Promise of Kin-dom.



Ascension is moving forward with sets of values, one of which is the value of courage and growth: that we reach toward possibilities. This is in partnership with the value of Faithful Stewardship of Time, Talent and Treasures: Sharing all that we have so no one will be in need.

Stewardship begins with God and what God has done, it does not begin with us. Think of a story where you've experienced God's presence, love, grace, and/or mercy recently? This might be a walk in God's creation, a conversation with a friend, or even the words of a favorite hymn. Consider sharing that story in worship, with a friend, or on a social media platform as we share the abundance of God's grace in our lives.

Stewardship is a discipleship practice, it is part of what we do as we grow in faith. It seems impossible sometimes, especially when we buy into the false narrative that there isn't enough. I encourage you to engage in prayer, worship, and stewardship as we embrace the Possible Promise of Enough.

Let us pray: Gracious God, thank you for all the things you have entrusted to our care: family and friends, food and shelter, money and talents. Be with us as we reflect on the ways you are present with us through this congregation. Guide us as we decide how much money to give to the congregation and beyond so that we can help do your work in the world. Amen.

The gospel of Luke invites the reader to explore the story of Jesus and his mission as the Messiah, God's chosen one. It is from Luke we hear the primary narrative of Jesus' birth to the stark images of his crucifixion. Luke describes how God has broken into the world by sending Jesus. We will not study all of the gospel of Luke in class, and yet this is a good time to commit yourself to reading the parts we don't study together.

We will begin Year C of our Lectionary cycle (the three year preaching cycle) in December as the new church year begins with Advent. Luke will be the central gospel in this year's lectionary.





Words Matter

"²For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is perfect, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. ³If we put bits into the mouths



of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. ⁴Or look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. ⁵So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits." --James 3:2-5a

Words matter. This is nothing new. All of us have been hurt, exploited, mischaracterized by words of others.

We are moving into a very difficult time in our country. As the political climate ramps up toward the election, there will be words spoken that are intended to sway and harm. Disagreeing on policies is one thing, and those issues need to be shared. However, name-calling, mischaracterizing and making fun of someone else is NOT! James writes in 3:10: "From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so."

We are called to be a public church. Voting is one of the ways we are involved in civil engagement. Scripture reveals that God is present in all realms of life, including political life. The church understands that the government is a means through which God works to preserve creation and build a more peaceful and just social order in a sinful world. Our baptismal promises include to strive for justice and peace I all the world. As each of us engage in our civil responsibilities, we do so with our theological understanding of God at work in our world. We participate in the electoral process as people of faith, and as a church we must be strictly nonpartisan.

Being nonpartisan does not mean saying nothing, especially when the actions of candidates or supporters behave and say things that are not of value. As people of faith, it is our responsibility to speak up when actions and words are unkind or hurtful. Again, disagreements are part of the discernment and this can and must be done with using our words carefully. We must also speak out against those who use hateful speech.

It seems like we have come to a time in society where hateful rhetoric and even physical violence is our go-to when we disagree. As people of faith, we can set an example. We can't remain quiet, for some will see that as agreement. We much speak out, we must be anti-violent, not non-violent; anti-racist, not non-racist, active, not passive.

Together, we can pray for our country without a partisan slant. I trust we all want what we see as best for our country, even though we disagree on what that may be. In Matthew 5:24, Jesus tells us to love our enemies and pray for those who hurt us.

As people of the Word, Jesus Christ himself, let us be mindful of the language we use, the language we agree to listen to, and the Word that we confess, Jesus. Let this be our witness and bold proclamation in the midst of struggle, disagreement, disappointment and concern. Hint—God still wins in the end. Let's not lose all hope.

Ascension Lutheran Church Endowment Fund

Did you know that Ascension has an Endowment Fund that is separate from the general fund or mortgage. It is the congregation's investment created in 2006 "to provide for mission work beyond the operational budget". This is not new!

Each year the Endowment Committee meets with Tri-Star Trust advisors to review the invested funds and to determine the interest amount available to award educational scholarships and to support outreach ministries of Ascension which all support our mission to "...boldly make Christ's vision known". This year Ascension was blessed and able to support the following as Christ has instructed:

- Mackenzie Morgan educational scholarship (gain knowledge): \$1,700
- ELCA Youth Gathering (make disciples): \$2,000
- Weekend Food Bags (feed the hungry): \$2,000
- Youth Worship Programs (know the Lord): \$926
- Sewing Group (give to the needy): \$2,000
- Women's Bible Study (grow in faith): \$500
- College Student Outreach/Care Packages (love others): \$500

So how did this Endowment Fund come about? Gifts celebrating special occasions and memorials were specifically donated for endowment. We would like to see this fund grow so that more ministries could be blessed. When remembering the loss of a loved one or celebrating a birthday, wedding, or anniversary you could give honoring the person(s) or event. Larger gifts can be given through bequests, retirement or estate assets, life insurance, etc. Gifts to the Endowment Fund are tax deductible.

Endowment money is not to replace your regular giving. Please continue to provide Ascension with your regular offering as money for the general fund and mortgage are vital. Gifts to the Endowment Fund are over and above your regular giving.



They are doing this in two ways:






