Lenten Worship

On Wednesday, March 5, 2025, we will begin the season in the church year known as Lent. This is a forty-day season (excluding Sunday's) that we focus on repentance (getting back on track with God) and preparation for Holy Week and Easter (April 20, 2025).



During our Wednesday worship, we are going to focus on various kinds of Lament. Each week we will explore what it means to sit with our grief rather than deny or push it aside. We all experience grief in our lives, and struggle with why so many suffer. We will approach God honestly and with humility, admitting that some things are too big for our hearts to bear, finding a God who weeps with us in our struggles. We will move toward the God who can take our grief and disappointment and transform it into holy joy and hope. We learn this through the death of Jesus on a cross, the place to which the season leads us. It is here we find we never need to mourn without hope.

- 7 p.m., Friday, April 18th—Good Friday service at Ascension Lutheran Church

Message from Pastor Julie

Daily Bible Readings on YouTube

A few weeks ago, I preached a sermon that shared some alarming statistics regarding the frequency of reading the Bible in a year, apart from being in worship or at a church event where it is mandated (I would guess this would be like devotions in a meeting, not necessarily a Bible study.) The research showed:

27% Never

14% less than once a year

9% one or two times a year

That means that 50% of people reported that they read the Bible less than two times per year!

Of the other 50%.

8% three or four times a year

7% once a month

8% once a week

14% four times a week

13% every day

My question is, how can we really know what the Bible says if we don't actually read the Bible ourselves? How many of us have heard someone say--the Bible says. I learned growing up that the Bible says God helps those who help themselves--later I found out that is nowhere in the Bible, and God is available to help those who can't help themselves.

We may have heard money is the root of all evil. This is a little closer to what the Bible says, but there is a significant different--the Bible says--the LOVE of money is the root of all evil. See the difference?

Love the sinner, hate the sin? God won't give you more than you can handle? Cleanliness is next to Godliness?

How can we truly discern God's will for us if we don't know what the Bible says? If the Bible reveals to us who God is, if it is the cradle that holds the Christ, it will benefit us to know what the Bible says.

It is hard to get into the habit of reading scripture. However, the discipline is important for those of us who follow Christ.

Beginning February 1, 2025, I began recording daily Bible readings. I began with 1 John, one of my favorite books, and over a few days we read all of 1 John. We then completed 2 John and 3 John. During the end of February and early March, we are reading through the gospel of Mark. We aren't skipping verses or skipping around. We are just reading the Bible as it is, translated into English of course.

These Bible readings are shared on our Facebook page and recorded on our YouTube channel (http://www.youtube.com/@ascensionlutheranchurch4799). I find it easy in the morning, before I even get out of bed to listen to this reading. What a great way to begin our day in the Word.

We are began our 2025 bible study on **Monday**, **February 3**, **2025 at 1:00 p.m.** at the Digging Dunes room at Ascension.



Saving Energy & All Exterior Doors

As most of you are likely aware, for security purposes, we keep the exterior doors of the church locked, with those entering with a key or pressing the Ring doorbell (at the front door). Many times, the outside door is propped open when a ministry team is entering for a meeting or event. During the cold (and very cold) months, our heat is escaping at a rapid rate, not only cooling the inside, but also increasing our energy bill as the furnaces run extra.

Going forward, if you are meeting in the church, we ask that you do one of two things.

- 1. Unlock the exterior door so that your team members can enter, but the heat stays in. (If you need *instruction on how to unlock/lock the door please ask)*
- 2. Have a team member wait by the inside door letting each one in individually, until all team members have

If you choose to unlock the door, please lock it again when you leave. You can designate a team member for this job or pull on the door handle each time you leave the building to make sure it is locked. (you may also lock it as soon as all team members arrive & you enter your meeting)

We want to be good stewards with the offerings we receive and I'm sure everyone would agree that we would like to use our offerings to "boldly make Christ's vision known" rather than hand it over to the energy company.



Ascension's Endowment—Grants & Scholarships

The Ascension Lutheran Church Endowment Fund Committee is accepting applications for 2025 to fund projects which may support any of the following activities:

St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were established by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two ways:

Scholarships for applicants age 16+,

who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan.

Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area.

The applications for both are posted on the Kiosk at church and available on our website.

Deadlines for both opportunities are the 1st of February, May, August and November, considered quarterly as funds remain available, apply early.

Note: Applications first have to be provided to the Ascension's office, where Council and/or Pastor need to sign. Ascension will then forward all documents to the committee for review.

Bertha H. Wilson Family Trust Fund Grants

The Saginaw County Evangelical Lutheran Churches in America (ELCA), working in cooperation with the N/W Lower Michigan Synod of the ELCA, administer the Bertha H. Wilson Family Trust Fund. It supports ministries of the ELCA congregations in Saginaw County. The grant application must be submitted to the Church Council for approval before submission. The Church Council will meet on **Tuesday, March 18th** and will review the applications. Once approved, the applications will be submitted as soon as possible. Application deadline is March 25th. This is one of the rare opportunities for Ascension to acquire funding for those special projects that are in the minds/plans of the congregation. Let your imagination run wild, and let's apply for a grant(s). Please keep in mind, projects which will benefit the community and serve as a source of outreach have a higher probability of being approved.
