Lenten & Holy Week Worship

As we continue in our season of Lent, our journey with Jesus to the cross, we are focusing on various kinds of Lament. Each week we explore what it means to sit with our grief rather than deny or push it aside. We all experience grief in our lives, and struggle with why so many suffer. We approach God honestly and with



humility, admitting that some things are too big for our hearts to bear, finding a God who weeps with us in our struggles. We move toward the God who can take our grief and disappointment and transform it into holy joy and hope. We learn this through the death of Jesus on a cross, the place to which the season leads us. It is here we find we never need to mourn without hope.

Message from Pastor Julie

Called to Make Disciples

¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."—Matthew 28:18-20

This is the Great Commission—what we as people of Jesus are called to do, make disciples. Disciples are follower and learners of Jesus. As we make disciples, we continue our own journey of discipleship, growing into our faith, maturing as people of God.

God's expectations are greater than the one's we have to maintain membership. In the early church, according to Acts 2:44-47: ⁴⁴All who believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds

Discipleship is about being in community, with Jesus and with each other; sharing what we have, praising God together in worship and in fellowship, sharing in communion, and encouraging one another in our faith journeys. Discipleship is about showing up, engaging, growing, encouraging. As we continue our journey to the cross, and as we will hear the best news ever-"Christ is Risen," death does not win!, how might you and I be more intentional on our journey and inviting others who are already part of Ascension and those beyond to join us in this journey.


Mary to Martha Women's Bible Study

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Updating Membership

The congregation council has approved a plan to address to review our current "membership" rolls and to update them as needed. Currently, our records show that we have 536 members, 90 of which are children (baptized, not confirmed).

The last time we intentionally reviewed membership was in 2018. Because of COVID and the hesitation of people returning to public worship, we postponed reviews. Our plan is to address membership annually, as defined in our constitution:



C12.07. The Congregation Council shall provide for an annual review of the membership roster.

Per our constitution:

- *C8.02. Members shall be classified as follows:
 - a. **Baptized** members are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have been received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by affirmation of faith.
 - b. *Confirmed* members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.
 - c. Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months.

If our records show that you have not satisfied the basic standards of voting membership, communed and have a contribution on record in the current or preceding calendar year, you will likely receive a letter from the congregation to clarify your membership. We will be requesting a response of whether you wish to remain a member and plan to participate more actively in the congregation, whether you are worshipping elsewhere or wish to have your membership removed for other reasons. We understand that we may be unaware of health or other issues that may prevent you from attending. If so, we want to be aware of needs and you can make us aware of those needs. And it is possible, our information may not be correct.

Please make note of the following information about membership as well:

- *C8.04. It shall be the privilege and duty of members of this congregation to:
 - a. make regular use of the means of grace, both Word and sacraments;
 - b. live a Christian life in accordance with the Word of God and the teachings of the Lutheran church; and
 - c. support the work of this congregation, the synod, and the churchwide organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America through contributions of their time, abilities, and financial support as biblical stewards.
- *C8.05. Membership in this congregation shall be terminated by any of the following:
 - a. death;
 - b. resignation;
 - c. transfer or release;
 - d. disciplinary action in accordance with Chapter 20 of the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America; or
 - e. removal from the roll due to inactivity in accordance with the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.
 Such persons who have been removed from the roll of members shall remain persons for whom the Church has a continuing pastoral concern.

Payment envelopes are available on the Acolyte Room Door, you can mail a check, or drop off payment when you are at church or during office hours (Monday-Thursdays 9am-2pm).

Saving Energy & All Exterior Doors

As most of you are likely aware, for security purposes, we keep the exterior doors of the church locked, with those entering with a key or pressing the Ring doorbell (at the front door). Many times, the outside door is propped open when a ministry team is entering for a meeting or event. During the cold (and very cold) or warm (and very warm) months, our heat (or cooling) is escaping at a rapid rate, not only cooling/heating the inside, but also increasing our energy bill as the furnaces/air conditioning run extra.

Going forward, if you are meeting in the church, we ask that you do one of two things.

- 1. Unlock the exterior door so that your team members can enter, but the heat/cool stays in. (If you need instruction on how to unlock/lock the door please ask)
- 2. Have a team member wait by the inside door letting each one in individually, until all team members have arrived.

If you choose to unlock the door, please lock it again when you leave. You can designate a team member for this job or pull on the door handle each time you leave the building to make sure it is locked. (you may also lock it as soon as all team members arrive & you enter your meeting)

We want to be good stewards with the offerings we receive and I'm sure everyone would agree that we would like to use our offerings to "boldly make Christ's vision known" rather than hand it over to the energy company.

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

St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were established by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two ways:

Scholarships for applicants age 16+,

who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan.

Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area.

The applications for both are posted on the Kiosk at church and available on our website.

Deadlines for both opportunities are the **1st of February**, **May**, **August and November**, considered quarterly as funds remain available, apply early.

Note: Applications first have to be provided to the Ascension's office, where Council and/or Pastor need to sign. Ascension will then forward all documents to the committee for review.

Affirmation of Baptism, also known as Confirmation, is the intentional act in faith to confirm the promises to continue in faith, the same promises made by their parents, guardians, sponsors and congregation when they received the Sacrament of Baptism.

Reminder to parents and youth—your final papers are due April 8, 2025. I will then present your names to the congregation council and inform them that you have met the requirements to be confirmed. As these youth are confirmed, they will become voting members of our congregation. We pray for these youth, their parents, and our congregation as we continue to support each other as we grow together in faith.

Elementary Youth Giving Envelopes

We thank you greatly for teaching your children about giving and



using their giving envelopes. Envelopes can be picked up in the Children's Church classroom. Each youth has their own giving number. It is VERY helpful to ensure that their giving is recorded properly to put their name and their giving # on

the envelope each week. There is a sign posted just inside the door of the classroom with all the giving envelopes numbers listed. You may also use any envelope you have at home, as long as their name and number is written on it.

Ragman—A Drama

The Ragman is a story written by Walter Wangerin Jr. It is a story of how Jesus enters into our lives at the most vulnerable of moments of life. It is the story of love, redemption, and healing.

On April 13th, the Middle and High School Youth will share this story with our congregation as the Word of God is shared through this drama. All Middle and High School Youth are welcome to participate, I am hoping we can share this at both services on Sunday.
