

Message from Pastor Julie

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

One of my favorite sermon illustrations that I didn't use this year tells of some ducks who worshipped on Easter Sunday. The duck family waddled to Easter services, and they were enthralled by the beauty of the flowers, singing of Alleluia, pews filled with ducks. The duck preacher told the congregation that everything was changed because Jesus had died and is now alive; Jesus is risen from the dead. Do not go back to life as usual, live into the resurrection. You can fly, you can fly! And the duck congregation shouted Amen, Amen! And at the end of the worship service, they all waddled home.



I hope you are laughing a bit, but there is some truth in this story. Like those disciples of Jesus' day, we are perplexed and amazed that death did not have the final say. They went to the tomb expecting to find Jesus' dead body, but he was and is not there! Life conquers death! Alleluia!

If we return to life as usual, with the harried schedules that don't make room for us to engage in our relationship with Jesus and with the body of Christ, we fail to live into this new life that is offered, has been ushered in, and renews the joy, the amazement, and the awe of life in Jesus the Christ.

Because of Jesus, we have confidence in the death and resurrection of Jesus. We will continue to pronounce Alleluia! Christ is Risen! This confidence in new life gives us the hope to see Jesus in the best and worst of times. As we grieve the death of loved ones, we hear the hope and promise that Jesus says we will be with him, that though we die we live. We hear that in Jesus the suffering, disappointment, and pain will be put to death by Jesus. We trust that even in a world that is all messed up, Jesus will right the world and invites us to be part of this in how we live out faith in a world that will scoff and mock us.

This is a time of renewed fervor. This is not the time to lock ourselves away in fear or forgetfulness. This is the time to renew our faith, our promise to live with Jesus each and every moment of life. We must not put it off for a later time, for a rainy day, when life calms down—because as I am learning, it never will. Jesus tells us we can fly. Jesus offers life, eternal life. Eternal life begins now!

Over the next weeks, there will be times that we can renew the covenant that God made with us in baptism, as we remember that we have died and have new life in Jesus. Seven of our young people will affirm their faith the end of April. We have several people who desire to join with us at Ascension to grow in their faith and to live out their faith in our community, by affirming their baptisms.



Renewed fervor requires participation and investment. New life comes at a cost, most notably the death and resurrection of Jesus. How will you participate with the body of Christ to grow in faith, to renew your trust, to gather with others as we hear the teachings, break bread, and share what we have? What investment will you make to enable Ascension to be a mission outpost to proclaim the confident message of Jesus with each other and with our community?

May you being each day—Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

We will take a break from Sunday morning studies during the months of June and July.




Mary to Martha Women's Bible Study

Updating Membership

The congregation council has approved a plan to address to review our current "membership" rolls and to update them as needed. Currently, our records show that we have 536 members, 90 of which are children (baptized, not confirmed).

The last time we intentionally reviewed membership was in 2018. Because of COVID and the hesitation of people returning to public worship, we postponed reviews. Our plan is to address membership annually, as defined in our constitution:



C12.07. The Congregation Council shall provide for an annual review of the membership roster.

Per our constitution:

- *C8.02. Members shall be classified as follows:
 - a. **Baptized** members are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have been received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by affirmation of faith.
 - b. *Confirmed* members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.
 - c. Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months.

If our records show that you have not satisfied the basic standards of voting membership, communed and have a contribution on record in the current or preceding calendar year, you will likely receive a letter from the congregation to clarify your membership. We will be requesting a response of whether you wish to remain a member and plan to participate more actively in the congregation, whether you are worshipping elsewhere or wish to have your membership removed for other reasons. We understand that we may be unaware of health or other issues that may prevent you from attending. If so, we want to be aware of needs and you can make us aware of those needs. And it is possible, our information may not be correct.

Please make note of the following information about membership as well:

- *C8.04. It shall be the privilege and duty of members of this congregation to:
 - a. make regular use of the means of grace, both Word and sacraments;
 - b. live a Christian life in accordance with the Word of God and the teachings of the Lutheran church; and
 - c. support the work of this congregation, the synod, and the churchwide organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America through contributions of their time, abilities, and financial support as biblical stewards.
- *C8.05. Membership in this congregation shall be terminated by any of the following:
 - a. death;
 - b. resignation;
 - c. transfer or release;
 - d. disciplinary action in accordance with Chapter 20 of the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America; or
 - e. removal from the roll due to inactivity in accordance with the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.
 Such persons who have been removed from the roll of members shall remain persons for whom the Church has a continuing pastoral concern.

Desiring Membership with Ascension

Have you been worshipping with Ascension and desire to intentionally join our ministry together? We are receiving information on people who wish to join Ascension Lutheran Church. To join one needs to be baptized, and we can discuss and arrange that if desired. Forms to complete may be found on our website (www.ascensionlc.org) under forms. We also ask that you complete a Time and Talent form for each family member to help us involve you in our ministry. Together we encourage one another to become the disciples God calls us to be in our world and community.



Voting members are confirmed members who have during the current or preceding calendar year communed in this congregation and made a contribution of record to this congregation. New members join by Affirmation of Faith, which is "Confirmation."

The JLGLBR intends to partner with or provide support to local non profit agencies in the form of "Time, Talent and Treasure" to further the objective. Bertha Wilson Grant Received for the Weekend Food Bags



The Bertha Wilson Family Trust Fund has awarded the Weekend Food Bags project a check for \$2,250. The following note was received from Bob LaDuke on the committee:

This note is to inform the ELCA churches in Saginaw County that the annual Grant Distribution process for the Bertha H. Wilson Fund has been completed for 2025. This year we had a total of \$12,500.00 available for grants. We received grants from 5 of the 6 churches in Saginaw county totaling \$15,250.00 requested. All churches that submitted grant applications received at least 75% of their requested amount. The grants received were put into classifications and they were 4 grants applied for help with Food, 3 grants for caring for the needs of others, and 1 grant geared


toward Discipleship. We encourage all churches to begin thinking about the 2026 grant process for the Bertha H. Wilson Fund and how your church can make an impact for those who can benefit from a hand up. Thank you for your participation and communication of this Grant process each year. We look forward to helping out in the future as we can.

Farm Bureau Michigan Agent Charitable Fund Grant Received for the Weekend Food Bags

The Weekend Food Bags was recently awarded a \$2,500 grant to fight food insecurity in the community by the Farm Bureau Insurance of Michigan Agent Charitable Fund(ACF). Ascension is one of ten organizations throughout the state to receive a Feeding the Future Grant from the ACF in April. Organizations are nominated by a local Farm Bureau Insurance agent and then selected by a committee. Farm Bureau Insurance agent Jennifer Howie nominated Ascension for the grant. Jennifer brought her Girl Scout Troop from Shields Elementary to assist filling food bags on April 1st.

Weekend Food Bags Program Update

Joyce Berg, Minister of Outreach, has worked many hours securing grants for the Weekend Food Bags program. We thank Joyce for the hard work she has committed to securing this program's future at Ascension. Not all members are aware, but the requests for food bags has increased in all three school districts.







Ascension provides for two meals for breakfast, lunch, and dinner with snacks. We strive to provide healthy food an elementary child can prepare. Hidden Harvest is able to provide leaves of bread, seasonal fruit, and various snack items. We purchase milk, peanut butter, jelly, oatmeal, pudding, applesauce, chef boyardee single servings, mac and cheese, cup of noodles, granola bars, cheez-its, fruit snacks, cheese crackers and fruit juice boxes. We deliver the food in recycled plastic or donated cloth grocery bags.

Our goal is to never turn a child away and to continue this program as long as we can obtain funding. In addition to the grants noted in this newsletter, the program has also received grants from the Grace Lutheran Endowment and the North/West Lower MI Synod Publicly Engaged Church. Ascension members and community members support the program through individual donations and the program is included in Ascension's budget. We thank and appreciate everyone who donates their time and talents to this program.

St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were established by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two ways:

Scholarships for applicants age 16+,

who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan.

Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area.

The applications for both are posted on the Kiosk at church and available on our website.

Deadlines for both opportunities are the 1st of February, May, August and November, considered quarterly as funds remain available, apply early.

Note: Applications first have to be provided to the Ascension's office, where Council and/or Pastor need to sign. Ascension will then forward all documents to the committee for review.
