### Message from Pastor Julie

### **Discernment**

As some of you may know, I entered into a recent time of discernment—a time of clarification of how God might be calling and using my gifts for the church. As my name was lifted to be a candidate for bishop in our synod, I determined that to be faithful, I needed to see the process through. First, I discerned that yes, I have some skills that would be used well in the office of the bishop. And second, discernment isn't just about what I discern, but also what the community is discerning. We might experience an internal call, but it is the affirmation of call from the community that helps clarify, what I refer to as an external call. With God's help, I am staying at Ascension, which I said to the assembly was the best gig a pastor could have—and I meant it. In this process, I discerned that God is continuing to call me to this place, for this time, with you—for as long as it works for us.

Upon returning, we had a council meeting. Our council has been working on discerning where the Spirit is calling Ascension Lutheran Church. We use a similar method—what do we think, and then we sort of test it out, what does the community think. We may try something new—and see how it goes. It may mean that some things we have done in the past aren't serving the purpose they once did, and we need to let that go. Change does not mean the way we used to do it was or is wrong, it is just time for something new, to go a new direction. This is all part of discernment.

In a few weeks, I hope to have a place in our congregation to mark our history as a congregation—to be able to track significant occurrences among our congregation with what was going on in the world. We have some of that history in a variety of places and if you would like to help organize that it would be greatly appreciated. Looking back helps us celebrate who and what helped us get to this place. Looking back isn't about returning to the past but using that to see the future, maybe to find a bit of the passion that led to some of the exciting ministries we have shared. It is a good opportunity to celebrate together and commit to moving forward.

The reality is, we are in processes of discernment all the time. Sometimes we get clear answers, sometimes we don't. My experience is that often discernment points us to where we are, to new adventures, and reminds us that the Holy Spirit is still at work in us.

Please join the council in prayer, as we pray for me (Pastor Julie), for our staff, for our council and ministry leaders. Let's be intentional about praying for each other. Let us pray for the Spirit to move our hearts to continue to proclaim Jesus in what we say and do. If you struggle coming up with the words for prayer, I invite you to pray one of my favorites from the Evening Prayer Service:

O God, you have called your servants to venture of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

### Bishop Elect Pastor Julie Schneider-Thomas, North/West Lower Michigan Synod

From May 18-20, 2025, Pastor Julie, Stephanie Becker, Lori Schultz, and Nicki Bieszk attended the Synod Assembly. There are a variety of things that happen at an assembly. We adopted a budget for 2026-2027, we adopted a memorial related to Indian Boarding Schools for the Churchwide Assembly to receive in August, we heard speakers from the other synods of our region, went to workshops, worshiped, and we entered into a discernment process for the election of a bishop. Upon the completion of five votes, our synod calls Pastor Julie Schneider-Thomas to serve as our next bishop of the synod.



The Bishop-elect currently serves two congregations in the Grand Rapids conference; Zion Lutheran in Comstock Park and Hope Lutheran in Rockford. She serves as dean of her conference and has served in a variety of ways during her time as an ordained pastor. She will begin her term as bishop on September 1<sup>st</sup>, with the installation service scheduled for September 13<sup>th</sup>. Please pray for Bishop-elect Schneider-Thomas, her husband Pastor Bryan Schneider-Thomas, her daughter Katie, and the congregations she currently serves who need to say good-bye.

We also hold Bishop Craig Satterlee in prayer after serving twelve years as Bishop. We pray for Pastor Chrisy Bright and Pastor Kjersten Sullivan as the assistants to the bishop, as well as the rest of the staff whose calls end with the bishop.

I am hopeful and prayerful with the leadership of Bishop-elect Julie Schneider-Thomas.

### **Updating Membership**

The congregation council has approved a plan to address to review our current "membership" rolls and to update them as needed. Currently, our records show that we have 536 members, 90 of which are children (baptized, not confirmed).

The last time we intentionally reviewed membership was in 2018. Because of COVID and the hesitation of people returning to public worship, we postponed reviews. Our plan is to address membership annually, as defined in our constitution:



C12.07. The Congregation Council shall provide for an annual review of the membership roster.

### Per our constitution:

- \*C8.02. Members shall be classified as follows:
  - a. Baptized members are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have been received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by affirmation of faith.
  - b. *Confirmed* members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.
  - c. Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months.

If our records show that you have not satisfied the basic standards of voting membership, communed and have a contribution on record in the current or preceding calendar year, you will likely receive a letter from the congregation to clarify your membership. We will be requesting a response of whether you wish to remain a member and plan to participate more actively in the congregation, whether you are worshipping elsewhere or wish to have your membership removed for other reasons. We understand that we may be unaware of health or other issues that may prevent you from attending. If so, we want to be aware of needs and you can make us aware of those needs. And it is possible, our information may not be correct.

Please make note of the following information about membership as well:

- \*C8.04. It shall be the privilege and duty of members of this congregation to:
  - a. make regular use of the means of grace, both Word and sacraments;
  - b. live a Christian life in accordance with the Word of God and the teachings of the Lutheran church; and
  - c. support the work of this congregation, the synod, and the churchwide organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America through contributions of their time, abilities, and financial support as biblical stewards.
- \*C8.05. Membership in this congregation shall be terminated by any of the following:
  - a. death;
  - b. resignation;
  - c. transfer or release;
  - d. disciplinary action in accordance with Chapter 20 of the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America; or
  - e. removal from the roll due to inactivity in accordance with the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.
    Such persons who have been removed from the roll of members shall remain persons for whom the Church has a continuing pastoral concern.

As of the end of April, our principal balance is \$295,557. We could not do this without you! Thank you for your offering to the building fund each month that has enabled us to pay down on the principal. Thank you to the diligence of the congregation council to make this a priority.

The last balloon adjustment for our loan is scheduled for 2026. We are hoping to have the mortgage balance at such a rate that it will be paid off now in six years and keeping our payment at a comparable rate as it is now.


