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2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly—July 28-Aug 2

Voting members from around the ELCA will gather in Phoenix, Arizona. The ELCA Churchwide Assembly is the primary decision making body of the ELCA. Voting members are elected from each synod and gather as one body to hear reports of what is going on in the church, consider proposals from synods including the North/West Lower Michigan Synod, elect officers and establish policies, adopt a budget, and this year the Assembly will elect a new presiding bishop, as Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will not be returning as Bishop.

The Assembly occurs every three years. This year the theme of the Assembly is "For the Life of the World." Dietrich Bonhoeffer said, "The church is the church only when it exists for others." In the Constitutions Statement of Purpose, we as church are "called and sent to bear witness to God's creative, redeeming and sanctifying activity in the world."

Looking Backward to Move Forward

I press on toward the goal, toward the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.—Philippians 3:14

We continue to pray and discern where God is calling us for a time such as this. It is a challenge to rely on what worked before or on what we have always done. We seek preservation rather than moving forward in faith. There is less risk, less conflict, less work.

God calls us to move toward Jesus, to move forward in faith, to press on in mission.

It might seem strange but one way to move forward is to look to the past. What was the original vision that shaped those earlier years? What values did the leadership embrace? What ministries had the biggest impact? How has the congregation and our community changed through the years? What has happened within our congregation and denomination that had impact on our congregation?

Our goal is not to return to the past, but to identify key moments that shifted the direction of our ministry. What were the trends or the common themes?

This not only provides an opportunity to bring clarity and focus moving forward; we also have an opportunity to honor the people who shaped the history of our congregation. This honor helps us build trust, which will be necessary to implement change. This looking back also tells our story to some of the people who were not here to participate in our mission at that time.

The practice of looking back isn't to return to what the church used to be; it's to return to what God wants the church to be!

Over the course of the summer, we have the opportunity to work on our historical timeline together. You are invited to post what you remember from that time, as well as we will be looking through documents that record our history. We will continue to pray together, dream together, discern together, and celebrate together the ministries God places on our hearts.

NRSV vs NRSVue—What Bible do we use in worship?

This is not an uncommon question as there are many translations of the Bible. One of the fun things in Bible study is that each of us use our own translations and we can get a deeper sense into what God is saying to us in that scripture text.

Beginning in July, the congregational texts for worship will come from the New Revised Standard Version-Updated Edition (NRSVue). We have been using the NRSV until now. The NRSVue is the official Bible translation of the National Council of Churches that is commonly used by mainline Christians. It is the first revision since the fall of the Berlin Wall and contains about 20,000 edits reflecting new scholarship on the Dead Sea Scrolls as well as stylistic changes to keep up with the evolution of the English language.

The NRSV has been called the most accurate of English-language translations, based on the availability of ancient manuscripts, textual analysis, and the study of language. Hundreds of ancient manuscripts have been studied and this research informed the translation of the NRSVue. The NRSVue brings greater precision in interpreting Scripture. The goal was to translate the ancient texts as accurately as possible while reflecting the cultural difference through time and conditions. This permitted the Editorial Committee to present the text as literally as possible and as freely as necessary.

Updating Membership

The congregation council has approved a plan to address to review our current "membership" rolls and to update them as needed. Currently, our records show that we have 536 members, 90 of which are children (baptized, not confirmed).

The last time we intentionally reviewed membership was in 2018. Because of COVID and the hesitation of people returning to public worship, we postponed reviews. Our plan is to address membership annually, as defined in our constitution:



C12.07. The Congregation Council shall provide for an annual review of the membership roster.

Per our constitution:

- *C8.02. Members shall be classified as follows:
 - a. **Baptized** members are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have been received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by affirmation of faith.
 - b. **Confirmed** members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.
 - c. Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months.

If our records show that you have not satisfied the basic standards of voting membership, communed and have a contribution on record in the current or preceding calendar year, you will likely receive a letter from the congregation to clarify your membership. We will be requesting a response of whether you wish to remain a member and plan to participate more actively in the congregation, whether you are worshipping elsewhere or wish to have your membership removed for other reasons. We understand that we may be unaware of health or other issues that may prevent you from attending. If so, we want to be aware of needs and you can make us aware of those needs. And it is possible, our information may not be correct.

Please make note of the following information about membership as well:

- ***C8.04.** It shall be the privilege and duty of members of this congregation to:
 - a. make regular use of the means of grace, both Word and sacraments;
 - b. live a Christian life in accordance with the Word of God and the teachings of the Lutheran church; and
 - c. support the work of this congregation, the synod, and the churchwide organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America through contributions of their time, abilities, and financial support as biblical stewards.
- ***C8.05.** Membership in this congregation shall be terminated by any of the following:
 - a. death;
 - b. resignation;
 - c. transfer or release;
 - d. disciplinary action in accordance with Chapter 20 of the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America; or
 - e. removal from the roll due to inactivity in accordance with the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.
 Such persons who have been removed from the roll of members shall remain persons for whom the Church has a continuing pastoral concern.

Desiring Membership with Ascension

Have you been worshipping with Ascension and desire to intentionally join our ministry together? We are receiving information on people who wish to join Ascension Lutheran Church. To join one needs to be baptized, and we can discuss and arrange that if desired. Forms to complete may be found on our website (<u>www.ascensionle.org</u>) under forms. We also ask that you complete a Time and Talent form for each family member to help us involve you in our ministry. Together we encourage one another to become the disciples God calls us to be in our world and community.



Voting members are confirmed members who have during the current or preceding calendar year communed in this congregation and made a contribution of record to this congregation. New members join by Affirmation of Faith, which is "Confirmation."







Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were established by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two ways:

Scholarships for applicants age 16+,

who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan.

At Ascension, First Communion is offered when the child, parent, and pastor believe the child is ready. If you have any questions, please contact Pastor Julie.






Elementary Youth Giving Envelopes
