Message from Pastor Julie

80/20 Rule—It isn't Biblical!

While at camp, I spend a lot of time observing. This week, as the youth were participating in Low Ropes it dawned on me how this correlates with how we often function as church or as an organization.

Low Ropes is a challenge course in which the youth work together to achieve a task and goal. It requires them to work together, communicate, and encourage one another.

While the youth were working on one of the challenges, I realized that the same small group of youth were the ones doing most of the talking and sharing of ideas at each event. Others might try to say something but they weren't as loud or the rest of the group wouldn't listen to their ideas. If they didn't succeed, they often reverted to the way they had done it before, including going in the same order that they had before, meaning some people got to try several times while others spent most of their time watching and encouraging the others.

You may have heard that 20% of the people often do 80% of the work. I saw this at work with our group. The Bible illustrates the Body of Christ much differently than the 80/20 rule. In 1 Corinthians, God paints a clear picture of the body of Christ, the church. The illustration is that we are all part of the body but different parts. Some of us are a toe, a kidney, lung-all gifted with different functions with Christ as the head. Of all the illustrations that Paul could have used, it is the analogy of the body with many parts that demonstrate how we rely and depend on one another.

Now you are the of Christ

It is clear that every single person has a part to play, something to contribute, and we are all important. The Bible isn't unrealistic, it is how God created us.

As we move forward in our mission, I encourage us all to figure out how we fit into this body of Christ, and to listen to each other. We all want to be heard.

NRSV vs NRSVue—What Bible do we use in worship?

This is not an uncommon question as there are many translations of the Bible. One of the fun things in Bible study is that each of us use our own translations and we can get a deeper sense into what God is saying to us in that scripture text.

Beginning in July, the congregational texts for worship will come from the New Revised Standard Version-Updated Edition (NRSVue). We have been using the NRSV until now. The NRSVue is the official Bible translation of the National Council of Churches that is commonly used by mainline Christians. It is the first revision since the fall of the Berlin Wall and contains about 20,000 edits reflecting new scholarship on the Dead Sea Scrolls as well as stylistic changes to keep up with the evolution of the English language.

The NRSV has been called the most accurate of English-language translations, based on the availability of ancient manuscripts, textual analysis, and the study of language. Hundreds of ancient manuscripts have been

studied and this research informed the translation of the NRSVue. The NRSVue brings greater precision in interpreting Scripture. The goal was to translate the ancient texts as accurately as possible while reflecting the cultural difference through time and conditions. This permitted the Editorial Committee to present the text as literally as possible and as freely as necessary.


Tuesday Morning Bible Study





St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were established by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two ways:

Scholarships for applicants age 16+,

who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan.

Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area.

The applications for both are posted on the Kiosk at church and available on our website.

Deadlines for both opportunities are the **1st of February**, **May**, **August and November**, considered quarterly as funds remain available, <u>apply early</u>.

Note: Applications first have to be provided to the Ascension's office, where Council and/or Pastor need to sign. Ascension will then forward all documents to the committee for review.
