Why do we take up an offering?

Why do we take up an offering? This is a question that gets raised from time to time, and in discussion with others I realize that maybe we don't know why we take up an offering. When asked—these are some responses, as well as others that I would anticipate:

We take an offering in order to:

Pay our bills and keep the church doors open

To pay for our pastor and staff

Because that is what we are supposed to do

It is like paying dues, and if we are a member we need to pay our dues.

Although there is some "truth" in the above statements (except for "d" which I will argue is NOT a reason at all), these are why we give. We may use some of the money that is offered, but it is not the reason we take up an offering.

"God of life, You have blessed us with every good gift. Open us to share all that we have been given and to love the world in Jesus' name." This is our offering prayer this season. It is a reminder that we give back to God with joy and thanksgiving what God has first given to us. It is our financial gifts but it is so much more than that. It is our time, our own person, everything we have. We give as thanksgiving for everything we have."

Offering is given in the context of worship, the time set aside every week for giving thanks to God. In the worship context, it is part of the meal, when we are giving thanks not only for Jesus and giving himself to us in the bread and wine, but also a reminder that everything we have is given to us from God. We are returning a portion of what God has first given us—our money, but also our time, talent and possessions.

Offering is also about being part of the community that is called to proclaim Jesus to the world. We are called to be participants, and our offerings provide the resources in which this is made possible. Whether it is our money, our time, our gifts, or anything else, we are part of the mission to make Christ known.

When we live lives of thankfulness, we can recognize the abundance of what God has given. When we live lives of fear, worry and doubt, we don't trust that God will provide for us as God has said-and we hold things back from being shared with others.

Let us pray, God of abundance, please help me to experience the joy of gratitude. Please help those I love to also know gratitude and help us all to embrace a spirit of joy. Amen.

Words Matter

²For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is mature, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. ³ If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we

guide their whole bodies. ⁴ Or look at ships: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. ⁵ So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits.

How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! ⁶ And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of life, and is itself set on fire by hell. ⁷ For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, ⁸ but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹ With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse people, made in the likeness of God. ¹⁰ From the same mouth comes a blessing and a curse. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. ¹¹ Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? ¹² Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.—James 3:2-12

From the same mouth comes blessing and curse—and I have heard both come out of mouths whom I respect and love. As people of the Word, of Jesus, we know the power of words and we also know they hurt and they heal. We hear political leaders, religious leaders, young and old, everyone use language that is disparaging to others, labeling people, calling people names, gossiping and spreading accusations. Taking words of Jesus, maybe a bit out of context from Matthew 20:26-'This is not to be so for us.'

People of God, friends, I implore us all to be aware of what comes from our mouths. If we want to see change in the world, we need to be the ones to set examples. We set examples for this change and living a life in Christ when we speak words of love and truth at home, at school, at activities, among our family and friends, everywhere. We can be a different example than those who get air space and social media space to call people out.

As a lover of Jesus, as one who believes that what God says is true and that we are to love all people, including those we disagree with or might even consider enemies, I am making it an intentional discipline to watch the language that I use, and in situations I am in, call out times when language is used as a weapon. We can speak truth without belittling or labeling others. I don't expect perfection, but I do expect effort.

Let us use our words, as the Word Jesus himself does, in expressions of love and grace, as Jesus came into the world to save the world, not to condemn.



Grace Lutheran Mission Endowment Report

This year the Grace Lutheran Mission Endowment Fund Committee awarded \$19,950 to fund various ministries in Saginaw County for the 2025-26 ministry year. The grants range in amounts from \$500 to \$6,000 and touch the lives of residents in Saginaw County in a variety of ways.

St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were established by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two ways:

Scholarships for applicants age 16+,

who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan.

Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area.

The applications for both are posted on the Kiosk at church and available on our website.

Deadlines for both opportunities are the 1st of February, May, August and November, considered quarterly as funds remain available, apply early.

Note: Applications first have to be provided to the Ascension's office, where Council and/or Pastor need to sign. Ascension will then forward all documents to the committee for review.

Ascension will serve at the Center of HOPE Food Pantry, 723 Emerson, Saginaw, MI 48607 on **November 12th**. Arrive at **8:30 a.m.** and 8-10 volunteers are needed. The next Truck Unload & Pantry Shelf Stocking is **October 1st at 8:30 a.m.**






