
Message from Pastor Julie

Giving Thanks

November is often thought of as the month we set aside for Thanksgiving. I love to gather for turkey, stuffing, potatoes, pumpkin pie, football ... The problem is when we only think about Thanksgiving in November!

Of course, I'm not talking about the food or football-though I would be happy with this meal every month. I mean being thankful. Living a grateful life. What if we lived every day in thanksgiving, living a life of gratitude.

I can get so caught up with all I have to do, or all that others think I need to do. I think of all the things I didn't get done today, deadlines looming, a to do list I won't be able to accomplish. Life becomes a chore. Each day just exists to get stuff done, and I miss out on really living.



That is where I believe thanksgiving comes into play. When we give thanks we condition ourselves to see what is beautiful around us, we see what God has planted in our lives, we respond in ways that are more fruitful. I often find I get more accomplished—but that isn't the point.

Paul often began his letters to the churches in the Bible with I give thanks for you always. There were reminders of the joy and purpose of life, not just getting so much done in a day or a lifetime. I wonder what our lives would be like if we committed to one another to begin each day in thanksgiving. We can give thanks daily for God's unconditional love and forgiveness, which in turn calls us to love and forgive. We give thanks for our community, our congregation who gather and pray for one another.

I give thanks for Ascension. As I write the article this month, the last couple days have been difficult with a lot of deadlines, things to do, responsibilities and constant reminders of how I should be doing more. And yet, in conversations of pastoral care or teaching, in times of worship and song I am drawn out of my selfishness into gratitude with and for the community. I give thanks that I have been called to serve with people that can use my gifts and who offer their gifts for the sake of our mission. I give thanks for the willingness to not always do the same thing over and over, to try new things, and to forgive when things don't go quite as we thought. When I am conscientious about giving thanks, I start to smile—and that feels good, it increases energy, and life doesn't feel so daunting.

I understand how hard it can be sometimes, but we have a savior who on the night before he was betrayed gave thanks, and in doing so gave us himself. He took bread and gave thanks—he took the cup and gave thanks—and reminded us to remember. Thanks be to God forever and ever.



GriefShare Support Group—Mondays at 6:30 p.m.

Ascension's Grief Support Group meets on Mondays at 6:30 p.m., through December 1st. The program they utilize is called GriefShare.

A GriefShare support group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Through this 13-week group, you'll

discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability—and gain solid support each step of the way. **Participant books are free**.

If you have book from a previous session, you may use that book again for future sessions. We do have several people who have attended the sessions multiple times and have found them beneficial as each time they are in a different stage with their grief.

There are no requirements to share, no pressure, and everyone is welcome! This is not just a group of people from Ascension, it is open to the community, so feel free to share with anyone you know struggling with grief.





Wellness Warriors—Tuesdays 6:15 p.m.

Getting Ready for Christmas Shopping? Order Your Gift Cards Through Ascension



Consider using Raise Right gift cards for your shopping this year. Raise Right is a fundraising program that Ascension participates with. All you do is purchase the gifts cards through Ascension (order form on the Kiosk) and we will order the cards for you—at no extra cost. You can use these cards to give as gifts or use them to purchase whatever it is you wish to buy. November orders must be received by Sunday, November 16th and December orders by Sunday, December 14th. (orders on Monday "usually" come in Thursday)

How does it work?—If you order a \$50 gift card from one of the stores you pay \$50, and the church receives \$1.25—at 2.5% interest. Some have much higher return. That may not seem like much, but every little bit helps. If you have questions see Pastor Julie or Lisa in the office.

St. John's Grants & Scholarships

Upon closing St. John ELCA in downtown Saginaw as a worship center in 11-01-2020, the process began to complete the transformation of the trust into a foundation. They strive to continue the programs that were established by the church an develop and offer support to programs and organizations that further the Gospel of Christ in the Saginaw Area. They are doing this in two ways:

Scholarships for applicants age 16+,

who are a confirmed member/employee of one of the ELCA churches in the Saginaw area and attending K-12, Jr College or University, or payment on their student loan.

Grants for programs such as Christian education, community health and welfare, social welfare, feeding and supporting the needy, supporting and assisting troubled youth, and aiding the poor in the Saginaw Area.

The applications for both are posted on the Kiosk at church and available on our website.

Deadlines for both opportunities are the 1st of February, May, August and November, considered quarterly as funds remain available, apply early.

Note: Applications first have to be provided to the Ascension's office, where Council and/or Pastor need to sign. Ascension will then forward all documents to the committee for review.
